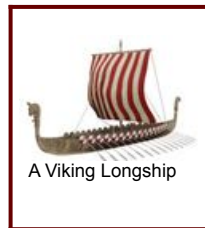

Not long after, both King Alfred and King Guthrum agreed to the Treaty of Alfred and Guthrum, establishing territories and the creation of Danelaw.
