

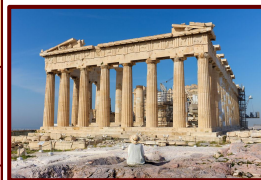

Each city-state was ruled by a powerful city, led by a ruler or government. * Greece is a warm country but winds from the Mediterranean and rains from the north kept temperatures livable and created fertile farming conditions. * Ancient Greek Myths are still read today. Alexander the Great	Alexander the Great, was a king of the Ancient Greek kingdom of Macedon. He was a famous warrior.	Acropolis	An acropolis is a fortified citadel within a larger city. It is usually located on top of a hill and at the centre of the city.
	Aphrodite	Aphrodite is an Ancient Greek goddess associated with love, beauty, pleasure and passion.	Assembly	In Athens the Assembly consisted of the group of citizens who showed up to vote.
	Hera	Hera is the goddess of women, marriage, family, and childbirth in ancient Greek religion and myth. She was the sister of Zeus.	Democracy	A form of government where citizens have a say in how they are ruled including choosing their leaders and deciding on laws.
	Hermes	Hermes was the ancient Greek god of trade, wealth, luck, sleep, language, thieves, and travel.	Oligarchy	A type of government where the power is held by a few people.
	Pheidippides	Pheidippides is said to have run from Marathon to Athens to deliver news of the victory of the battle of Marathon. He was central figure in the story that inspired a modern sporting event, the marathon race.	Olympics	An athletic event held by the Ancient Greeks every four years.
	Zeus	Zeus is the god of the sky, thunder and lightning in Ancient Greek religion and myth, and was the King of the gods on Mount Olympus.	Titans	The Titans were the first Greek gods.
