Dear Parents and Carers,

I have to say how impressed we have been with the way the children have returned after the half-term holiday. They have picked up where they left off and there is a wonderful sense of calm productivity around the school. The earlier opening of the doors at 8:40am has meant that the children are able to start the day with reading and phonics alongside the plan for the day, all of which makes for a great learning environment. It is always a busy half-term and this year it will be busier still as we will be putting on Christmas plays and Carols services - more details will follow in the coming weeks.

On Monday, we held our first LAB (Local Area Board) Meeting for the year. It was lovely to welcome Jane Price, the Chair and other parent and co-opted members back into school after such a long time and have a tour of school to celebrate our achievements so far. The LAB meeting itself looked at the priorities for the year ahead and how the LAB members can act as "critical friends" to ensure we provide the best for all children to reach their academic and personal potential. Our 5 main priorities this year are:

- Reading fluency and comprehension
- Improving outcomes in Maths
- Fully embedding high expectations across all staff, pupils and parents in the culture and behaviours for learning.
- Coaching and mentoring to support and improve Teacher effectiveness
- Improve academic and personal potential through enhanced use of digital technologies

We also spoke about how we can continue to ensure that Colley Lane Primary maintains, but also promotes, the nurturing, caring community that makes it so special.

Thank you for your support with the PE uniform as we mentioned in the last newsletter. The children are looking very smart in their plain coloured tshirt and hoodies. Some parents have mentioned about just having purchased items and I would not want anyone to buy additional trainers or hoodies just for PE but as they grow out of the old, please replace with the PE uniforms requirements.

This week, you might have seen on Class Dojo or our Twitter page that all the classes have been taking part in work around Remembrance Day and contributing to the Royal British Legion by purchasing poppies and other items, which will also be available next week. Next Thursday at 11am, we will fall silent as a school to show our respects alongside the rest of the country to all those who have fallen in conflicts around the world.



We have shared in assembly today the Firework code as the weekend approaches and you might like to talk to your child about this. Please have a wonderful time if you are celebrating Diwali or Bonfire Night but keep safe.

Lates

Leaving school early

In order to ensure there are minimal disruptions to the children's learning at the end of the school day, children should not be leaving school early unless:

- it is for an appointment that we have been made aware of beforehand and we have been given or shown a letter/medical card/medical appointment text.
- if school has asked you to collect your child early due to them being ill in school.

Attendance;

If you child is ill with any of the following 3 symptoms they need to self-isolate immediately and you must carry out a Lateral flow test or book a PCR test as soon as possible:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste.

Please let school know any test results, or if your child is going to be absent for this or any other reason by;

- Calling 01384 900450 and speaking to a member of staff or leaving a message.

- Reporting their absence via the ParentMail App.

Please note if someone in your household has tested positive, children must still attend school as long as they have no symptoms or have tested negative.

What's been happening in school this week?

<u>Nursery</u>

This week children have started to learn about different celebrations. They have been focusing on Diwali, the festival of light. Children have had fun exploring and playing with coloured rice making rangoli patterns and also firework pictures using paint and stencils. Next week they will be learning about another celebration, Bonfire Night.

They have started to explore their new whole class reading text, Owl Babies, and will continue with this next week. In phonics, they have been passing sounds around the circle developing turn taking and listening skills by copying the pattern they heard.

<u>Reception</u>

Reception children have also been exploring celebrations and in particular Diwali. They have learnt the story of Rama and Sita, used masks to retell the story and also sequenced using pictures. Children have made their own diya lamps in the playdoh area and made their own bracelets and jewellery in the creative area. In maths we have started to explore the concept of addition through part part whole diagrams and we have also learnt more sounds in phonics (please see class stories on class dojo for the letter formation rhymes).



Next week they will be learning about another celebration, Bonfire Night, and continue learning about their new whole class reading story What the Ladybird Heard Next.

<u>Year 1</u>

What a busy week we have had in Year 1! We began by sharing our super firework pictures in our assembly on Monday. We read a Firework poem and then explained how to stay safe around fireworks.



As part of our Mutual Respect and Tolerance Day we took part in activities such as 'Friendship Bingo' and shared stories such as *Willy and Hugh*. We thought about what it is like to feel 'left out' or 'different' and what makes each of us special.

In Science, we had fun sorting animals into different groups such as 'swimmers' or 'climbers'. We used ipads to take photos to record our ideas. Then we learned about the 5 different ways to group animals such as 'mammals'. This linked with our new class



story The Koala Who Could. We were finding facts out about Koalas and discovered that they are marsupials!



In English we loved joining in with the rhymes when sharing the book *What the Ladybird Heard*. We then made 'Wanted Posters' describing the two robbers and made maps of the farm. This linked nicely with our Geography Theme work when we made maps of our routes from home to school! They were fantastic!

<u>Year 2</u>

Welcome back! Year 2 have had a brilliant first week back following the half term break. It was lovely to see the children's enthusiasm when they came into school on Monday, and this positivity has continued all week. We had a great start to the week where we were exploring the British Value of Mutual Respect. We thought about how we were similar and different to each other, and celebrated that each of us is unique. We also looked ahead to Remembrance day where we created some poppy art, using a range of different techniques including finger painting and collage. In maths we have begun to look at measure this week, measuring things in the classroom and comparing the length of different objects. In English we have been collecting nouns and adjectives which we will use to help us write a setting description. We also began our new Geography theme this week. Over the coming weeks, we will be exploring the human and physical features of our local environment and then comparing it with a city on another continent! Keep up the great work Year 2, and keep earning those Class Dojos!

<u>Year 3</u>

Welcome back Year Three. We have had a very creative week; as you know we've been finding out about Remembrance day and produced a collaborative piece of poppy art. You may have seen we've designed our own rangoli patterns for Diwali and also written cinquain poems reflecting on respect, tolerance and friendship. In P.E the children have been combining a jump, roll and two different balances, again showing their creativity. We have begun our new Geography theme this week and have been recapping which countries make up the U.K and their capital cities. The children enjoyed using an atlas to locate the cities. We will be comparing where we live to Wales over this half term and looking at rivers and mountains.

This week the children have found out our new class book is' The Nothing To See Here Hotel'. It's set in Brighton so we've been finding out on our map where Brighton is and what it looks like.

In Maths we are adding and subtracting when regrouping is needed. The children have been using equipment to make the numbers to physically be able to regroup when needed before recording the calculations using the column method. A good first week back. Have a lovely weekend everyone.

<u>Year 4</u>


Welcome back to the Autumn term! We hope you had a lovely break. The children have enjoyed being back at school this week. On Monday we participated in a British Values day where we talked about mutual respect. The children identified ways in which they can show respect with friends, family, at school and at home. Many children commented that they would complete more chores at home and keep their rooms tidy to show their respectful nature so look out for this at home! On Monday, we also spent a few hours finding out about remembrance and why poppies are important. We then used watercolours to paint poppies after we had sketched them. The main highlight of this week was introducing the children to our new book 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'. We used our iPads to make the pictures of the characters talk using Chatterpix. We are really excited to read this firm favourite this term.

<u>Year 5</u>

It's been a great first week back to the second part of the Autumn term. On Monday, we started our week by reminding ourselves of the British values, mutual respect and tolerance. We have made links with our ASPIRE character virtues and kept these at the forefront of our mind throughout the week. In Science, we have continued with our Earth and Space topic. Using globes and torches, we have investigated day and night. Additionally, we have created some fantastic Remembrance Day artwork, using watercolours and silhouettes. Check out Class Dojo to see some photos. We started our new class reader, Holes by the author, Louis Sachar. The setting of our story is at Camp Green Lake, where there is no green...and no lake!



<u>Year 6</u>



We have had a lovely first week of our second half term in Year 6. This week, we began our new theme, 'Vanishing Rainforests'. The children have started to research where the rainforests are around the world and have begun to understand about the environment that can be found there. In reading, Year 6 have started their new whole class reading text, 'The Graveyard Book' by Neil Gaiman. We have completed lots of activities relating to graveyards, ghosts and ghouls and of course, Halloween itself.

In Art this week, we have been creating our own individual poppies as part of our Remembrance Wall. Each child has used their own style (including paint, collage and paper art) to create their designs. They look fabulous!

Netflix Age Ratings

You will be aware that Netflix is hugely popular across all ages but there have been concerns in relation to age ratings and the type of content that is recommended to viewers. Like many other services, Netflix uses algorithms to determine what you might like to watch based on viewing history, what you have liked etc.

Since last year, Netflix has been working with the BBFC and 100% of the content on Netflix is now age-rated to BBFC classification standards. It is the first UK streaming service to accomplish this.

Free School Meals

If your child is in Reception, years one or two, you will automatically be entitled for free meals under the new 'Universal Infant Free School Meals' criteria.

However if you do meet the criteria listed below then you will need to submit an online claim in order for your child's school to receive Pupil Premium funding.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit Run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit (you must have less than £616.67 a month net earned income (after tax and not including any benefits)

Children who receive a qualifying benefit in their own right are also allowed to receive free school meals. Children under the compulsory school age who are in full time education may also be entitled to receive free school meals.

Infant free school meals in England

Your child will be able to get free school meals if they're in a government-funded school and in: reception class, year 1 and year 2 Tell your local authority if you also get any of the qualifying benefits. Your child's school can get extra funding if you do. If you wish to apply for Free School Meals click here <u>Free School Meals</u> or collect a form from the office.
