
Just a reminder that if your child needs an inhaler in school, please can you come to the office to fill in the relevant paperwork. You will be asked to leave one inhaler in school.

Attendance

New Covid19 Guidance - effective from Monday 17th January 2022

Changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for COVID-19

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will reduce their isolation period to 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be <u>reported to NHS Test and Trace</u>.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two Lateral Flow tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take Lateral Flow tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.

What's been happening in school this week?

<u>Nursery</u>

In Nursery this week the children have continued learning all about Winter. We have enjoyed exploring what happens during winter and will be taking a Winter walk around the school grounds next week to see the seasonal changes!

In Maths we have been practicing our counting using the counting stick. We have worked on orally counting forwards and backwards between 0 and 10 as well as introducing finger numbers. The children have been challenged to show the correct number of fingers throughout the week at different times and are all getting very good at them!

This week we have introduced our new whole class reading story by looking at where the book is set and meeting some of the main characters. We have found out that our new story will be set at the zoo and we have been introduced to some of the animals we will meet in the story and some of the noises they make!

<u>Reception</u>

In Reception this week the children have continued learning all about Winter. They have learnt some new adventurous words to describe winter and have had a go at writing some new words and phrases. It has been wonderful seeing how well the children have been applying Phonics in their writing!

In Maths we have explored time and looked at seasons, days of the week and months of the year. The children did really well using our 'Star Words' in their discussions, including talking about the different activities they do both at school and home during the week, and when discussing their favourite time of the day. Not surprisingly, this was dinner time! In play it was lovely watching the children explore clocks and sand timers. The children used the sand timers to time themselves doing some exercise challenges! It was great to watch the children organising their activity and taking turns.

This week we started a new Whole Class Reading book. We learnt about goats, explored some new vocabulary and looked at animal habitats. Before we revealed our book, the children got the chance to be creative and draw their own trolls! The children let their imaginations run wild and we had some wonderful trolls, including a rainbow troll and another which had a spiky body! We read our book 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' before having fun acting out the story.

What a fun packed busy week we have had! Have a lovely weekend everyone.

<u>Year 1</u>

This week we started our new Science topic on plants. We looked at the different parts of a flower and talked about their functions. We will be planting seeds over the next few weeks, to find out how to make them grow and how to keep our plants healthy.

We have continued with our Aspire theme and this week we have been thinking about what skills and qualities are needed for different jobs.

We have also been talking about working collaboratively so the children had to work as part of a team, organising themselves to decide who needed to do what job in order to complete a task. We have some born leaders in Year One!

<u>Year 2</u>

We have had another wonderful week in Year 2! We have continued our aspirational theme focusing on the learner skill, communicating clearly. We enjoyed working collaboratively with our partner by giving each other instructions on how to draw something. We had lots of fun seeing how successful we were! We have also looked at how we can be more responsible for our own things and actions.

Throughout our English lessons we have immersed ourselves in all things Fantastic Mr Fox! We have focused on the characters this week and have even had a go at creating some of our own. Within our writing lessons we have started to look at instructional writing. The Year 2 children have written command sentences to instruct someone to make goose and liver doughnuts.

In maths this week we have concluded our block on multiplication and division. To show off our maths skills we have done lots of reasoning, problem solving and have even been maths detectives. Thank you to all the children who took part in our first TTRS competition and well done to 2D.

It's been great to see the children back at forest school this week. The children were set on a special mission: to find some worms for our wormery. Luckily they succeeded and we now have some new additions to 2E and 2D, who are getting used to their new habitats.

We hope you all have a lovely weekend and we look forward to seeing you all next week.

<u>Year 3</u>

A creative week in Year Three. The children have had a focus on Winter and read, planned, composed and performed their own Winter themed poems. Some beautiful descriptions of snowflakes, ice and snowmen. The theme continued into Art. The children looked at images of snowflakes and discovered every snowflake is unique. They drew several designs before selecting one to create out of cotton buds. There are examples of their work on Twitter and in our Art gallery.

In Science we have been finding out the 7 colours in light and seeing how important light is. Without light sources we found it difficult to see and so worked collaboratively on how to represent the impact of there not being light; the impact on safety, work, plants and our mood!

Multiplication has been the focus over the week in Maths. Can the children explain what 'commutative' means? Children, keep working on TTRS across the week at home to secure your times tables and division skills.

'Goth girl and the ghost of a mouse' is our new whole class reader this half term so the children have been finding out what mansions are like inside as well as the gardens. We have been using the book cover and map of Ghastly Gorm hall to predict what we think might happen. The children are desperate to start reading it now!

Our ASPIRE theme has had a focus on character traits this week. Some great discussions communicating which traits the children felt were the most important. Lots of different opinions. The children will be bringing Bingo cards home to collect ways of demonstrating their character traits; responsibility and respect as two examples. Maybe some room tidying, table laying or drying up the dishes over the weekend!

<u>Year 4</u>

Another fantastic week in Year 4. We have been very practical this week doing lots of activities involving actions and objects. We kicked off our new science topic of sound by investigating how different sounds were made using musical instruments and thinking about sources of sound. The children loved exploring (and making as much noise as they could!)

In English we have begun looking at instructional writing. We read, followed and annotated a variety of instructions including a recipe to make Mexican bean burgers and how to create a 7x table fortune teller. We particularly enjoyed competing against one another in a game of battleships after unpicking the instructions.

The Boy at the Back of the Class is proving to be a real hit with the Year 4's! This week we have read up to and including chapter 5. We have been introduced to Ahmet and discussed what a refugee was. The children showed great empathy when discussing why Ahmet had moved to London which was lovely to see.

Continuing with the theme of empathy, in theme this week we were looking at people who face adversity. The children completed a range of tasks including lip reading, doing everyday jobs with a hand behind their back and having to identify objects from just a description. We are working towards answering the question 'Can everyone achieve?'

Finally in maths, we have been exploring equivalent fractions. We created our own fraction walls and used these to find equivalents to a half, a quarter and a whole. The children were fantastic at spotting links between the numerator and denominator and using this to find even more equivalent fractions.

Not forgetting of course on Tuesday we started our Spanish lessons with Mrs Fernandez and our drumming with Mr K. What a busy week it has been! I wonder what next week has in store for us. Have a lovely weekend all!

<u>Year 5</u>

It has been a rewarding week for Year 5 children this week with lots of new experiences and quality discussions linked to our ASPIRE values.

English and Theme - Children explored how the ASPIRE values are embedded in many career paths and realised the fantastic opportunity to practise them now and throughout their education. We reviewed job adverts for the content and also the writing skills required to write our own job advert next week.

Reading - We have started our new class book, *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* by *Lewis Carroll*. We have enjoyed reading the first two chapters and have found the comments made from Alice, during her confusion, to be amusing. This book gives children a different style of writing, from a different genre and also time period. We hope they enjoy it just like many children and families have over many generations before them.

Maths - Children started their new focus in Maths Mastery, fractions and decimals. We have explored how to write and draw equivalent fractions and also how to convert fractions into hundredths (ready for future work on decimals and percentages). Fractions are sometimes one of the most fearful topics in maths but children have given each task their best efforts and, as always, support will always be given to address any misconceptions.

Science - This week, we used our iPads to record our findings from our investigation using force meters. Each group selected five objects and predicted the mass before weighing them using scales. They then predicted the value in Newtons and used equipment to check. Children are enjoying the practical aspect of this science block and are looking forward to future investigations.

One action packed and exciting week over and now we look forward to the next. Have an enjoyable weekend.

<u>Year 6</u>

What a fantastic first full week we have had back at school! The children have been eager to learn and they have really enjoyed the beginning of our new topics in Theme, Science and in English.

Our new Theme topic is based around 'Role Models and Aspirations' and the children have been thinking about careers they might like when they are older as well as challenging gender stereotypes in certain careers, such as being a nurse or a pilot. They have also learnt about two of Mr Smith's role models from when he was growing up, although still relevant today, that of Sir David Attenborough and David Beckham.

We have also started a new Science topic which focuses on living things and their habitats. In our first lesson, the children have focused on how we can classify animals based on their type, nutrition and skeletons. There were lots of discussions based on which animals were vertebrates and invertebrates.

In English, we have started reading 'No Ballet Shoes in Syria' which has already been a real eye-opener for the children as to the plight of refugees from Syria and other countries. It was brilliant to see and hear such empathetic discussions around refugees and the struggles that they face.

In addition, we just wanted to let you know that we are in the process of planning our second school trip of the year for after half term, aligning with the new Theme topic. No big reveals just yet though; although it does coincide quite nicely with the timing of the Easter holidays.

Finally, just a quick reminder that the children should be reading at home for 10 minutes a day and recording in their Reading Record. Have a wonderful weekend everyone.

Free School Meals

If your child is in Reception, years one or two, you will automatically be entitled for free meals under the new 'Universal Infant Free School Meals' criteria.

However if you do meet the criteria listed below then you will need to submit an online claim in order for your child's school to receive Pupil Premium funding.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit Run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit (you must have less than £616.67 a month net earned income (after tax and not including any benefits)

Children who receive a qualifying benefit in their own right are also allowed to receive free school meals. Children under the compulsory school age who are in full time education may also be entitled to receive free school meals.

Infant free school meals in England

Your child will be able to get free school meals if they're in a government-funded school and in: reception class, year 1 and year 2 Tell your local authority if you also get any of the qualifying benefits. Your child's school can get

extra funding if you do. If you wish to apply for Free School Meals click here <u>Free School Meals</u> or collect a form from the office.
