Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been lovely welcoming Mr Meckin, Director of Primary and Mrs Lanckham, Teaching and Learning Lead for the Trust to the school today. They had a wonderful time visiting the children and staff in their classes, observing the learning that was taking place and the engagement from the children. The behaviour shone through and when Mrs Lanckham spoke to a group of KS2 children, she was very impressed with how they spoke about Colley Lane and the way that they were supported. We also have finalised the dates for our Parents Evening for this term. The dates are Wednesday 13th October and Thursday 14th October. I am looking forward to holding the meetings at school in the children's classrooms once again. You will be able to look at their book and see the progress that they are making. Booking will be quick and easy via ParentMail, further details will follow soon.

We have reviewed the new start and finish times and I am pleased to see how well they are working. Please remember that the doors close at 8.55am prompt so to avoid your children being late and missing the start of the day. Doors are opening at 8:40am for the main school and 8:55am for Nursery to allow for more time to get into school with congestion.

You may have noticed if you come to school via the Slade Road entrance that we have opened both gates for improved access. This is working well but I would ask all parents with young children to ensure that they do not run ahead as we know it is a busy road. I am speaking to Dudley MBC to see if the safety outside the entrance can be improved.

Attendance

A quick reminder of current Covid19 guidance

Individuals are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and any of the following apply:

- · they are fully vaccinated
- they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
- they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Instead, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a <u>PCR test</u>. We would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so.

When do children need to isolate?

Children need to self-isolate if they have any of these 3 symptoms of COVID-19, even if they are mild:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste.

If your child has any of the above, they should self-isolate straight away and get a <u>PCR test (a test that is sent to</u> the lab) on <u>GOV.UK</u> as soon as possible.

Children should also self-isolate if:

- they've tested positive for COVID-19 this means they have the virus
- they've been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace following contact with someone who tested positive

 find out what to do if you're told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or the NHS COVID-19 app.

If a pupil is asked to get a PCR test if they are identified as a close contact by NHS Test and Trace and they have no symptoms, they may continue to attend education until they get the result of their PCR back.

If a child lives with someone who has tested positive, they should continue to go to school.

What's been happening in school this week?

<u>Nursery</u>

This week Nursery children have been reading the book The Colour Monster and learning to recognise their feelings. They have been exploring this further through play, such as using playdough to make different faces and emotions and developing their fine motor control at the mark making table. The children have also been using a range of resources with care and have started to build some amazing towers, bridges and buildings.



<u>Reception</u>

Reception children have also been reading the book The Colour Monster and started to learn about how to manage different emotions. We are teaching the children, if someone is doing something they do not like to say "Stop, I don't like it." We have also talked about our thinking tree, which is in class, as a place to go if you are sad, worried or confused like the colour monster in the story.

The children have developed their listening skills this week through taking part in daily phonics lessons. Activities included using musical instruments and parts of their body to make different sounds. Why don't you have a go at home!

<u>Year 1</u>

At the beginning of the week, the children were able to show off their super pictures and collages of fruit and vegetables in our Harvest assembly.

Later in the week they were able to share their own beautiful photographs and enjoyed sequencing them to make their very own timelines as part of our History based Theme lesson, thank you for your support with this. They were all delighted to see how eachother had grown and changed.

The children also made the most of the sunshine by carrying out science investigations based on shadows, you may have noticed the chalk outlines of children on the playground. What a great week Year 1, well done!

<u>Year 2</u>

We've had another fantastic week in Year 2, delving deeper into our 'Will we ever get to Mars?' theme by exploring the achievements of Tim Peake. We thought about the questions we would like to ask him if we were to ever meet him, as well as watching clips of him living in space.

In art, we have been further exploring line, investigating how we can use lines to create different effects. This will lead into next week where we will be developing our knowledge of portraits by creating a portrait of Tim Peake, using line.

In science, we have been working scientifically. This week, we had some skittles and we poured boiling water over them. We watched as the sugar dissolved and a skittles' rainbow was made. We made some excellent predictions about what might happen.

We are also really enjoying Beegu, our whole class reading text.

<u>Year 3</u>

A busy week in Year Three with lots to be proud of. The children have continued to work as a team in PE lessons and have been collecting dojos for being collaborative and resilient. Some fantastic partner work in gymnastics. The children gave feedback to each other and worked on enhancing their balances. We have been questioning and exploring while being historical detectives in Theme this week. We looked at pictures of Queen Victoria and read facts about her. The children discussed why she was a significant figure. Lots of great thoughts and ideas.

We are continuing our journey with Sophie in 'The BFG'. We have used images and extracts from the book in our Writing lessons too. We were able to think of a wide range of synonyms to help describe the giants. Using the thesaurus helped us to improve our vocabulary choices. We're looking forward to seeing what happens next in the story.

<u>Year 4</u>

Year 4 have kicked off their new theme this week 'Stone Age to Iron Age'. We went outside to create a timeline to show today's date, the year 1AD when Christians believe Jesus was born and we even showed the date 2,000,000 BC. We learnt that AD means Anno Domini and that BC means Before Christ.

In our afternoon theme sessions this week, we read 'The First Painting' which is a lovely story as to who created the very first painting. We then created our own Stone Age paintings using paints, chalks and water colours. We have also been learning about The Stone Age in our comprehension lessons. We are looking forward to our Stone Age to Iron Age workshops next week where they are central for your child's understanding of this theme. The children thoroughly enjoyed it last time we had these visitors in and as we have not had any visitors or trips for a few years it really will be key to their enjoyment of the theme. <u>Year 5</u>

There has been lots happening in Year 5 this week. We have created a character description of Mr Hazell from our book: Danny Champion of The World. Our art lesson linked to our book with children creating self-portraits in the style of illustrator Sir Quentin Blake. During theme, we discovered where Ancient Greece is placed in our ASPIRE history timeline and also key historical events that took place within that time period.

There is a 5A vs 5C vs 5W TT Rockstars battle taking place over this weekend. We hope many children can take part in the battle as well as completing their home reading targets.

<u>Year 6</u>

This week, year 6 pupils have been asked the 'big question': 'Who ruled Ancient Egypt?'. They have created. They have learnt about some of the most famous Pharaohs and explored the meaning of symbols associated with the Pharaohs.

They were challenged to design a Sarcophagus to contain a Pharaoh's body in the burial chamber. They were also challenged to study and design an Egyptian death mask. Take a look at some of the intricate designs.

Free School Meals

If your child is in Reception, years one or two, you will automatically be entitled for free meals under the new 'Universal Infant Free School Meals' criteria.

However if you do meet the criteria listed below then you will need to submit an online claim in order for your child's school to receive Pupil Premium funding.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit Run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit (you must have less than £616.67 a month net earned income (after tax and not including any benefits)

Children who receive a qualifying benefit in their own right are also allowed to receive free school meals. Children under the compulsory school age who are in full time education may also be entitled to receive free school meals.

Infant free school meals in England

Your child will be able to get free school meals if they're in a government-funded school and in: reception class, year 1 and year 2 Tell your local authority if you also get any of the qualifying benefits. Your child's school can get extra funding if you do. If you wish to apply for Free School Meals click here <u>Free School Meals</u> or collect a form from the office.
