Key Mantras of Little Wandle

Key Mantras of Little Wandle					
Mantra	Explanation/ Example				
Digraph – two letters, one sound	Used to highlight that a sound is represented by two letters. E.g. 'ai'				
Trigraph – three letters, one sound	Use to highlight that a sound is represented by three letters. E.g. 'igh'				
Spot the digraph/trigraph	When READING Identify any sounds which are represented by more than one letter in the word before reading the word. E.g. 'ai' in train				
Sound talk	When READING Sound out the word before attempting to blend. E.g. t-r-ai-n				
Blend	When READING Blend the word together e.g. 'train'				
Whisper blend	When READING Child whispers the letters to help them blend when reading as a stage between overtly blending out loud and blending in their head.				
Blend in your head	When READING Child is encouraged to blend in their head rather than out loud.				
Chunk it up	When READING Split longer words into parts to make them easier to read. E.g. train/ing ladd/er e/vent/ful This may be done by covering part of the word with your hand or the child may use their finger when in a book.				
Segmenting fingers	When SPELLING Ask children to hold up their hand ready to count the sounds – use the hand they DO NOT write with.				
How many sounds?	When SPELLING Break the word down into sounds and put a finger up for each sound to count them. This helps children to not miss any graphemes when writing (although they may not always choose the correct grapheme it should be phonetically plausible – e.g. selecting 'ay' instead of 'ai'). E.g. train – t-r-ai-n (4 fingers would be up)				

We have also been focusing as staff on reading. This is a key school priority and the more reading that your child gets involved in, research has shown that the better academic outcomes they will have both in primary and secondary school. Early reading starts with Phonics in EYFS and Key Stage 1 and as a school, we use Little Wandle as our approach. The diagram opposite explains some of the terms that your child may refer to and what they mean. You can use these terms when listening to your child read or ask them to spot digraphs or trigraphs - they are very used to these terms. There is also a link to the Little Wandle website and resources for parents on how to say the different sounds.

Finally, there are still tickets for the Friends of Colley Lane events on 12th and 13th December so please support the school with these ventures.

What's been happening in school this week?

Nursery

This week in Nursery the children have enjoyed practising the nativity play along with reception. We sing the songs everyday and have even had a chance to practise on the stage!

In WCR this week we started to learn about our new book. We found out that the new book is set in a house and discussed who lives in our houses and the different rooms our houses have. We then looked specifically at the kitchen and thought about the different activities that happen in the kitchen at home. Next week we will continue to find out more about our story. I wonder what it might be.



In Phonics this week, we have recapped our previously learnt sounds and learnt our new sound of the week. Our phoneme this week was 'i'. We introduced the iguana picture card and played a blending game with the words ink and imp. The children have also been working on recognising the initial sound in their name.

In maths, we have continued to look at 2D shapes. This week we have been focussing on square and rectangle. The children have been using the vocabulary sides, corners and vertices to describe each shape. We have also been looking for shapes within the Nursery setting.

On Thursday, the children were very excited to come to school as it was the first day of Advent. They were keen to tell us about their Advent calendars and they also helped the teachers to decorate the classroom with lots of tinsel in preparation for Christmas! They even decorated their own tree which they can decorate and add to each day.

Reception

Reception children have continued with their Write Stuff lessons this week and have learnt about a boy called Norman who had wings! The children have used words like peculiar, draped and eccentric to create sentences. In phonics, children have learnt the digraphs ff, Il and so using the phrase two letters one sound. They have also been blending words



with these graphemes at the end of words and we will be moving onto reading phrases and sentences next week. The children are really enjoying their phonic sessions and are applying their taught skills through play which is lovely to see.

In maths, children have started to learn about subtraction by splitting the whole into different parts and using the sentence 5 subtract 2 is equal to 3. Next week children will be learning to retell stories using the words first, then and now.

On Thursday, the children were very excited to come to school as it was the first day of Advent. They were keen to tell us about their Advent calendars and they also helped the teachers to decorate the classroom with lots of tinsel in preparation for Christmas! They even decorated their own tree which they can decorate and add to each day. To end the morning, we went on a Christmas tree walk around school to see each year group's trees.

Year 1





We've enjoyed getting into the Christmas spirit this week in Year 1. The children spent some time making Christmas decorations thinking they were going to be put up in class! You can imagine their surprise when they walked into school to see our very own Year group tree in the corridor adorned with their decorations!

There isn't long left until we welcome Parents into school for our Christmas Craft and Singing event and the children have been working hard practising our songs. The children also made their own leaflets advertising our Christmas event which they took home. We hope you can make it!

In PE the children have enjoyed learning how to be gymnasts with Mr Blount. They have been working hard

on their balance and coordination skills and have thoroughly enjoyed their sessions.

In English the children finished writing the final parts of their postcard and will next week have a go at independently writing their own postcard. The children have also been showcasing their fabulous writing in whole class reading where they have written letters from the giant from the story Jack and the Beanstalk. The children have really enjoyed our whole class reading book, 'The Jolly Postman' and have been so excited opening the different letters inside the book.

Year 2

Christmas has arrived in Year 2 this week, with the arrival of our very cheeky elves! We can't wait to see what mischief they get up to! The children were so excited on Thursday when they saw the classrooms and corridor decorated for Christmas.

In writing this week, we have been continuing our learning all about postcards. The children have 'chotted' and written all about the adventures of Sonny the meerkat on his quest to find the perfect Christmas. The children have used adjectives, adverbials and conjunctions to make their writing more exciting. We can't wait for the children to write their own versions next week. The children have been very creative in art, making their own perfect trees. We

had painted trees, collaged trees and even cactuses!


We have been multiplying in maths, using arrays to help us! We have grouped counters into the arrays, using counters and the children thought about the repeated addition and multiplication equations to go with them. Year 3

A jam-packed four days in Year Three! The children have had a creative few days; singing our Christmas songs in school and we know at home too, alongside making their tree

this week we have been recapping what the terms and 'physical geography' mean and using that through a wide range of features. We looked at

Wales and its landmarks and found out how Welsh children prepare for their saint's day - David. Can the children tell you what is special about the city of St. David's?

The children have been communicating clearly in Maths as they needed to explain how they answered their addition and subtraction calculations using regrouping. Their confidence has grown across the week with many more children getting to try the green calculations! We found that we were needing to use number bonds and known facts to help us.

The children have continued to enjoy using the ipads in their independent learning time and have been using Purple Mash for Geography and Art; Edshed for phonics and spellings and TTRS to work on multiplication and division skills. All of these can be used at home too.

We are looking forward to another busy week next week singing our songs, doing Christmas activities alongside our normal lessons and on Friday it's our Christmas party! Details to follow next week.

If the children could all keep learning and singing their carol concert songs at home that would be great and we look forward to seeing you, if you can, at the church on the afternoon of Tuesday 13th December.

Year 4

It has felt like we have achieved so much in the shorter four day week!

Alongside working on our daily subjects, we have also been busy practising our carol service songs. Children are already looking forward to performing in front of parents/carers. As a reminder, Year 4 will be performing alongside Y6 on Wednesday 14th December. We look forward to seeing as many families as possible but appreciate it is a busy time of the year.

During our English lessons this week, children have practised using: adverbials, similes, relative clauses and also short sentences for impact. They have written their independent writing each lesson on their iPads as we trial seeing what our daily independent writing looks like within one document. Children certainly are enjoying their English lessons.

In maths, we have started a new unit based on how we read and interpret data. We began by reading and creating pictograms and finished the week reading and interpreting bar graphs. During our maths meetings, we have been busy working on our times tables and this will remain one of our focuses during next term.

During our Individual Learning time, children have used the Century Tech website (link) to independently work on their individual targets. If you would like your child to complete any additional work at home, this would be the ideal resource as it will create bespoke targets for your child.

The children created Christmas tree decorations during our theme lessons this week and they were surprised and pleased to see their decoration displayed on our Year 4 Christmas tree. Each child had their own wooden tree decoration and were tasked with creating their own unique design and to write a message. These will be sent home during our final week.

Our spelling focus this week is words ending with -ly. The spelling assignment went live Thursday at 1pm. As normal, children are asked to complete five spelling activities.

We have so much to look forward to in the final two weeks of this term. We look forward to sharing these moments with the children and (where possible we will share on Class Dojo too). Have a wonderful weekend.

Year 5

Another week has come and gone; we have been so incredibly busy!

The week began with another set of fabulous swimming lessons. The children have really gotten into their Tuesday morning routine, arriving ready and raring to go. The children are already making great progress, showing a range of skills, including paddling, kicking, treading water and even full strokes across the pool. We are so proud of their achievements, keep it up Year 5!

This week in Science, we investigated meteors and how craters are formed on the moon. We tested our ideas using flour, chocolate powder and marbles, dropping them from a height to form craters. We had so much fun and made a bit of a mess!

In Theme, we have been studying volcanoes. These natural structures have captured our attention as we have

been exploring the Earth's tectonic plates and their movements. We have looked at the different ways the plates move under the Earth's crust and how volcanoes are created from these. At the end of the week, we created our very own class volcano, which exploded! It was so incredibly exciting!

In English, we came to the end of our recent writing topic - Scott of the Antarctic. We wrote our own independent diary entries as explorers in the Antarctic, on a mission to film emperor penguins in the south. The children did a fantastic job, including a range of exciting techniques in their writing and using their imagination and creativity to develop their ideas. We have been so impressed by them all!

With only two weeks of the term left, we have a number of fabulous activities coming up:

Year 6

This week, we have had a focus on assessments. However, we have managed to cram in a lot of fun activities too. In our assessment week, we have been practising SAT exams. The children self quizzed all week and showed us what they have learnt so far this term. It is fantastic to see children progress in different areas of the curriculum. Well done to those children that tried their best.

In our afternoon sessions this week, the children really enjoy taking part in a whole class debate on saving the rainforests. The classes were split into two halves with one half being against deforestation and the other being for deforestation. They needed to convince those on the opposing side that they have the most persuasive, realistic and valid points. At the end of the lesson, they voted on which side to take. They had to include facts and statistics as part of their debate alongside emotive language. Again, well done to all children for taking it seriously and giving some valid points.

Also in our theme lessons, we have been painting face masks for the Yanomami tribe. The children used a variety of mediums to design and decorate a traditional Yanamami face mask.

We are also well under way with our preparations for the Christmas Carol Concert, which will now take place on Wednesday 14th December. The children are really starting to enjoy the Christmas songs and we are looking forward to sharing them with you. In school this week, the children were warmly welcomed to a fine display of Christmas trees in the school corridors. There is a competition to see which year group has decorated their Christmas tree the best?


