Dear Parents

We are looking forward to welcoming you into school next week for the first Parent Evenings of this academic year. As I have said previously, the children have settled well into their year bands and classes and we are looking forward to sharing their work and books. You will notice when you come into school that we have invested in smarter exercise books to help raise the pride and standards across the school but also that the feedback and marking within school has progressed too.

As a staff, we carried out a review in the Summer term of the existing CLPA feedback policy, researching the purpose and different types of effective feedback but also how teachers use the time spent on marking. A different approach was trialled and found to not only enhance the effectiveness of feedback but also maximise learning opportunities for the children. We therefore made the decision to move away from the traditional models of marking to a more analytical and reflective approach where teachers are empowered to select the method of feedback they feel will benefit children's learning best at that time and improve learning outcomes for all. This approach involves a greater emphasis on live marking, as a whole class, group or individual.

Parents evening will also be an opportunity for you to claim any lost property. We will be putting out lost property in the hall and please could I ask that any clothes that come into school are named. Named uniform will always makes its way back to the children.

A huge well done to Mrs Bevan who entered the school into the Arnold Clark Football kit competition and won! We have a brand new kit making it's way to us as we speak. The school has also invested in new PE t-shirts to make us shine and look the part this year at competitions. We have a proud history of sporting excellence amongst many other achievements, so it is always good to have a smart kit for the children to wear when they represent Colley Lane.

What's been happening in school this week?

Nursery



We have had a lovely week in Nursery finishing off our Autumn topic. The children have really enjoyed exploring all the natural Autumn resources and using the new vocabulary to talk about them. They also thoroughly enjoyed our reading sessions on Wednesday. Thank you to all of the parents who were able to make the session and enjoy some time crafting with their child. It was wonderful to see so many of you and to welcome you all into Nursery for the first time.

This week in WCR, we read our new story 'Dear Zoo' and recapped the vocabulary which we had learnt last week to guess which animals were in each crate. The children were very good at thinking about each word and deciding which animals they might be describing. On Wednesday, we enjoyed exploring the 'Dear Zoo' book further with the support of Dudley MBC Family Learning and our parents. Next week we will begin a new story, I wonder what it might be?

In Maths this week, we have continued to look at sorting object by one attribute. We started the week by recapping our learning on sorting objects by colour and then began to focus on sorting things by their size. We read the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears to help us think about different sizes. We then used some props to decide which objects were for Daddy Bear (big), Mummy Bear (Medium) or Baby Bear (small). You could support this at home by asking children to use vocabulary such as big, medium, small, bigger and smaller to compare 2 objects.

Next week the children are starting to learn more about different emotions. They will be exploring emotions over the next two weeks using the stories The Colour Monster and Rainbow Fish.

Reception

Reception have had a fantastic week learning all about Autumn. Each class went on a leaf hunt around school and had lots of fun exploring and talking about Autumn.

In PE they have been developing their listening skills through following two step instructions. They have been learning how to do star jumps with Mr Blount and also how to travel in different ways. Encourage your child to practise star jumps at home and send a video or photo to your child's class teacher!

In maths children have been talking about patterns and explaining what they can see using the sentence stem The pattern is ... Children have made some lovely patterns in play with a range of resources using size and colour to create their pattern.



In whole class reading, children have explored the story The Little Red Hen. The children have learnt about working together, being collaborative and kind. They also roleplayed the story using puppets and props.

This week the children have learnt about our Aspire character value being responsible. We talked about being responsible for our learning, our classroom, our actions and our choices. Please continue to let your child's class teacher know of examples of your child being responsible at home so we can share this news with their class. If you could send a photo that would also be great!



Next week the children are starting to learn more about different emotions. They will be exploring emotions over the next two weeks using the stories The Colour Monster and Ruby's Worry.

Year 1

We have had a lovely week in Year 1. We came to the end of our first Write Stuff writing unit and have seen some wonderful engagement. The children have really enjoyed sharing their words and have shown good resilience when writing some challenging sentences. Our classroom displays have really spurred the children on to be super word collectors and sentence writers with children eager to have their picture displayed. Next week the children will take on their first independent writing task and we're sure they will be great!



In Maths we have begun to look at subtraction using the part whole model and number lines. The children have been using the correct language when discussing their answers with their partners and the class.

In Science this week we began our new theme, 'Animals including Humans'. The children had fun drawing around each other and labelling different parts of the body.

Our Whole Class Reading unit started with an exploration of Australia this week. We looked at different animals, particularly Koala Bears and learned a range of facts including how Koala's aren't bears at all! . We ended the week being creative and painted Koala pictures in the style of Aboriginal dot paintings.

Year 2



Year 2 had a brilliant afternoon being scientists, exploring different materials that we could find and use in our classrooms. We then went on a materials hunt around school, and explored the different properties of the materials that we found.

In English we reached an exciting part of our story, where our main character met a small, green alien on the moon! The children had lots of fun experimenting with similes and compared the character to peas, kiwis and apples. Next week we look forward to finding out about how the boy eventually finds his way back home.

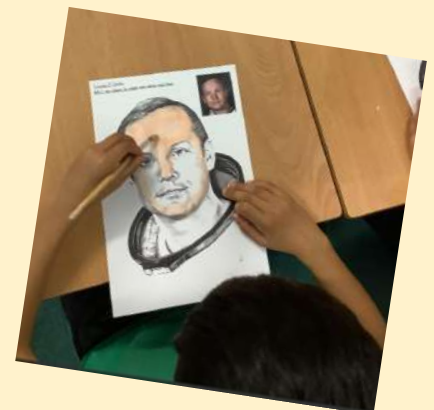
We have loved reading more of our class book: Beegu, and we have been having

some brilliant conversations about Beegu's feelings at different parts in the story.

In our Maths lessons this week the children have compared and ordered numbers to 100, using their knowledge of place value. In our Maths Meetings we have been singing songs about the days of the week and months of the year. We have also been practising writing numbers as words.

We had a fantastic art lesson where we were exploring what happens when we mix together different colours. We discovered that we can make new colours, and we can also change the tone of colours by adding more or less white paint. We will use this knowledge to help us add more detail to our portraits over the coming weeks.

We have continued our theme this week, comparing the achievements of Neil Armstrong and Tim Peake. We were very impressed with all of the facts the children remembered from our previous lessons. The children had so much fun exploring space for themselves whilst pretending to be Neil Armstrong. They used the Now Press Play headphones to help them imagine what it would be like to travel around space and see what life could have been like for the astronaut. They flew rockets and even tried moon rock! The children



are keen to go on their next adventure!

In all of the lessons, children are continuing to show their ASPIRE character values and learner traits. Well done Year 2!

Year 3



Lots of children in Year Three have brought in entries for the Space week competition which is great to see. Keep the posters/poems, models or artwork coming! The children enjoyed learning about the moon landing in 1969 and the role of Katherine Johnson, a talented mathematician who worked for NASA.

We continued with our 'Rocks' topic and discovered some rocks are harder than others. Are lunar (moon) rocks weak or strong we wondered. The children saw sandstone, back here on planet Earth, was weaker rock compared to granite, an igneous rock. Can the children recall how these rocks are formed?

Our writing links in with the space theme too. Tom has found a star in a jar and doesn't know who it belongs to or why it has arrived. The children have been using adjectives, verbs and questions to describe Tom's experience. Today we imagined we were Tom, listening to nighttime sounds. We heard a real range of animals scurrying, rustling and screeching.



Maths has been continuing to explore numbers. The children have ordered, compared and added and subtracted 10/100. We spotted not every digit changed when we did this. Being number detectives is exciting - lots of pattern spotting and investigating. Keep working on number bonds and TTRS at home too.

In Theme the children have been researching to compare the lives of rich and poor Victorians. They 'put themselves into the shoes' of a Victorian child to describe and imagine a day in the life of. Being a chimney sweep, working in the coal mines, helping to make small chains in the yard or working in the dangerous factories did not sound good! The children are feeling quite lucky to live in 2022!

Year 4

We've had a wonderful week in Year 4 linking our theme and writing lessons and making our learning stick. Children researched the Neolithic Age and discovered how people lived and survived during this period of history. Children also completed their first double-page spread on Skara Brae and this also helped children explore life in this era. During next week, children will be writing their own version of Stone Age Boy but theirs will be from the Neolithic Age.

In maths, children have practised solving addition and subtraction word problems. Children worked with teachers (and then talk partners) to identify the key information and used part-part-whole and column

methods to work out their tasks. This is a tricky concept and children are doing well. Well done to 4H who won the TT Rockstars Year 4 battle. The new TT Rockstars battle is boys vs girls. It goes live at 3:30pm today.

This week's spellings focus on the prefix 'in'. Spellings have been shared on Class Dojo. This week's Spelling Shed assignment is also live and children are asked to complete a minimum of three activities. Each Monday, children complete a low-stake quiz.

Year 5

Year 5 have been working incredibly hard this week in all their different subjects.

The children have begun to explore their new Science topic of Space this week; a perfect time to start with the launch of National Space Week! They have been exploring the different planets in our solar system and comparing the sizes and distances between the planets. The children were amazed by how large the Sun was compared to Earth. What a great way to start our new topic!



In Reading, the children have continued on their adventures with Danny in our whole class reading book. The children are really loving this Roald Dahl classic and are so eager to find out what happens next! In Writing, the children have continued to produce outstanding work in their sentence stacking lessons. They have explored a range of skills including complex sentences, metaphors and personification. Year 5 even had an additional treat on Monday when they got to taste popcorn and orange pop, to experience cinema food as our character in the book did during her adventures. How fantastic!

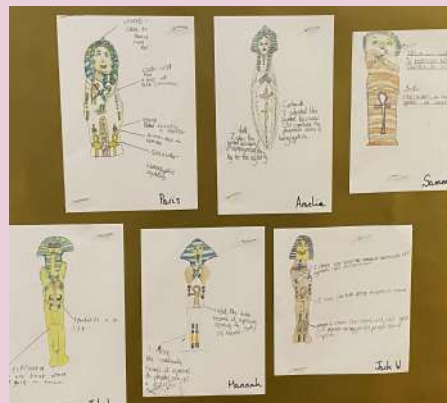
In Theme this week, the children have been listening to Ancient Greek myths and legends, learning stories including Theuseus and the Minotaur, Odysseus and the battle of Troy and Icarus with his wings. The children created their own mythical creatures and had a go at creating their very own myth or legend. Additionally, the children explored the Ancient Greek Olympic Games; they learnt about the many events that were undertaken in the past as well as how these compare to the modern day Olympics. It really has been a fascinating week.

Year 6

What a fun-filled week we have had in year 6 this week!

We kick-started our week with a Special Science Week and Black History Month assembly. The children learned about Katherine Johnson who was a very talented mathematician that worked for NASA in the 1960s. Well done to Max, Scarlet, Bea and Lucas who read out important facts about her. They read so clearly and were very confident. As part of Science Week, WIndsor Academy Trust have launched a competition! Children can write a poem, write a story or even draw a picture all about space etc. and send it into school. There are prizes to be won!

For our Ancient Egyptian theme we have been creating our own pharaoh headdress photos with photos taken on our iPads with pastels. Some children decided to place a snake on their head dress which was said to protect the pharaoh. Children have also been adding other work to our display.



Within our history lessons, we have been writing instructions on how a mummy was mummified. The children found it really gruesome when they discovered the brain was pulled out of the skull with a hook through the nose! After they had written instructions, the children followed the process but with a tomato!



In Science, the fun continued with children learning about how Charles Darwin discovered evolution by researching finches on the Galapagos islands that had migrated from mainland South America. Each of the islands had different seeds available for the finches to eat. Darwin observed that the finches were identical to each other and to those on the mainland except that they had adapted their beaks to be able to eat the food available on their island. This adaptation happened over many years. Darwin believed the finches had evolved. So to replicate this in class, the children used different beaks (tweezers, pegs and tongs) to investigate the different seeds (Maltesers, silver balls, Starburst) the different beaks could pick up to see how the finches evolved.



Our Weekly Art of Happiness saying or activity you can discuss at home - *'You just bumped into someone from Planet Glum, which just happens to be the most miserable planet in the universe. Explain 'happiness' to them. What is it and where does it come from?'*
