The children have started their new themes around Geography and Global issues from plastic pollution to "Do we think we live in a fair world?" During assembly on Monday, we looked at the UN 17 Sustainable Development Goals and classes debated which they felt were most important for their class. **No Poverty** and **Good Health and Well-being** were the most discussed and over this term, we will be looking into how we can raise awareness about these. It also links with our work on sustainability with the Ministry of Eco-Education. ## **Nursery**

This week in Nursery we have started to look at our new topic all about space. The children have been excited to learn all about the Solar System and have been exploring lots of new vocabulary.



Throughout the week we have been watching some videos about meteor showers and rocket launches. We have also listened to

snowers and rocket launches. We have also listened to some stories being read in space which the children really enjoyed.



The children have also had the opportunity to explore space further through continuous provision. They have been role-playing as astronauts, exploring and naming different planets, finding and identifying phoneme rockets as well as counting asteroids!

## Reception

This week in Reception we began our new topic all about space. The children have enjoyed learning about our solar system and the different planets. We also explored this new topic through our new space station in the classroom!

We have also watched a video about the solar system and different facts about the different planets. The children were in awe of how many planets there are in the solar system! disappointed that someone had littered in their classroom! After discussing the damage littering does to the planet they set about making 'No Littering' posters.


We had some wonderful designs as you can see!




When the children had completed their posters they set about clearing the rubbish, carefully selecting that which could be recycled! Well done Year 1!

next week and the children can't wait! They had an extract in our Domain lesson this week to 'wet their appetite'!


#### Year 4

#### Year 6

We have had a jam-packed week in Year 6 this week!

Firstly, we went swimming on Tuesday to Halesowen Leisure Centre. Many children were very nervous as it was something new for many of them but everyone was brave and showed courage by having a go!

On Wednesday, we had a fun-filled afternoon! Some children had the opportunity to learn a new sport-volleyball! Some children, who are going to Windsor High School and Sixth Form, began their transition

sites and the devastation they can cause to the planet and the ozone layer.

To test this, we created our own landfill bottles. We created three bottles: one control bottle with only water inside, one with banana peel and water and another with orange peel and water. We wanted to investigate how anaerobic respiration at landfill sites creates methane gas which damages the Earth's atmosphere.

It worked! Take a look at our photos from start to finish our conclusion, composting is a much more environmentally friendly way to dispose of food waste.
