Dear Parents and Carers.

As part of Windsor Academy Trust's big moves for the future, sustainability is very much a priority, with the Trust moving towards being a carbon neutral organisation. There have already been a number of initiatives across the Trust from installing solar panels, LED lighting and moving away from paper copies of documents and we are now looking at how we can incorporate sustainability into our curriculum. As part of this, we welcomed Paul Turner from The Ministry of Eco Education, a charity that works with schools and communities to look at teaching resources but also help put sustainability at the heart of what we do. Alongside Great Wyrley and Cheslyn Hay High schools, we will be working with Paul to look at our curriculum and school site to see how we can weave sustainability into what we do but also be more creative with the spaces

we have. Paul worked with staff and held an assembly for KS2 around the climate and our planet. Did you know that earth is called the "Goldilocks Planet?" Some of the children did and could share their passion for the topic. As the work with Paul continues we will keep you updated.


Reception

To end our theme all about books the children took part in a Now Press Play experience. They all wore headphones and listened to and acted out the story Little Red Riding Hood. It was a lovely experience for the children as they acted out the story as if they were Red Riding Hood. It was also a great opportunity to explore stories in a different way and a chance for the children to develop their listening skills!



Year 1

This week we launched our 'Magic Moments' Art theme in Year 1 which focuses on Minibeasts. The children enjoyed talking about their favourite and least favourite minibeast before going on a minibeast hunt. In our first art lesson we explored how artists use simple lines to create vivid art. We practised drawing different lines, from straight to wavy to thick and thin before the



children put their new knowledge onto paper by completing drawings of insects. The children focussed brilliantly on their drawings and completed some wonderful pieces of art.

Year 2

This week in Year 2 we have been starting our new theme 'Ice Worlds' and our new Whole Class Reader text. We have used the characters from our new story to help us with our writing. We used exciting vocabulary to describe features of Bean, Boggis and Bunce. They are all evil, horrid crooks!

In art, we have explored the work of Frances Hatch and thought about our opinions of her art work. Also, we got creative when using acrylic and watercolour paint to practise painting techniques, ready to help us create our background next week.

In Computing this week the children have been coding using an algorithm. They have been making the 'Beebots' move using compass directions and then used coding language on the ipads to make the online turtles move.
