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What's been happening in school this week?

Nursery

We have started to look at our new topic of growing this week. The children have enjoyed exploring how different things grow including humans, animals and plants. Throughout the week, the children have been exploring growing through the continuous provision and have learnt new vocabulary to support their knowledge. They have particularly enjoyed exploring the soil and bulbs in the sand area.





Reception

This week the children have started a new topic all about growing. They have worked really hard to write shopping lists for the garden centre, instructions on how to plant seeds as well as tricky words on flowers. On dojo is a list of tricky words and some song links so your child can practise writing, reading and singing at home.

<u>Year 1</u>

This week in Year 1 the children planted their own runner bean as part of our Science topic on plants. We explored different parts of a plant, thinking about their functions as well as using new vocabulary in our discussions. The children really enjoyed planting their bean and have been examining their plant pot daily to see any signs of growth!

Next week the children will look back at the different stages of planting their bean and write their own instructions.

Year 2

We have had another shorter, yet busy week in Year 2, where we began the week with our new science focus 'Animals including humans'. We learnt all about the things animals and humans need to survive. In our theme lessons, we have found out more information about the events of The Titanic and ordered these in chronological order on a timeline. In our classes we retold the events using actions to help us remember what happened and made a storyboard to show these events. As we are getting closer to the end of our theme, we wanted to let you know that we will be having a Titanic focus day when we come back after half term (W.C. 5th June) as our 'Fantastic Finish'. Children will be asked to dress up for this day but more information will be sent out on class doio.

Year 3

Lots of opportunities to use digital technology in class across this week.

In Reading lessons they have researched the meanings of unfamiliar words and found images to clarify; for example differences between a forest and a jungle in a lesson starter. In Writing, they researched their chosen natural disaster to help when writing their non chronological report.



In Maths the children used QR codes to access activities to consolidate learning. They were exploring the properties of 3D shapes so were then able to create venn

diagrams to sort and classify shapes. Have a go!

<u>Year 4</u>

We've managed to fit so much into our four days again this week.

Our highlight of the week was certainly our theme work, building on our learning from our theme day. Children created their own individual double-page piece of research about the Vikings invading Britain. Each and every child created unique pieces of work, displayed and set out differently, which is absolutely fantastic and what we would like to see.

Next week, we have our Fire Safety workshop on Monday and our visiting musician for a music workshop on Friday. Lots more to look forward to.

In Science the children revisited prior learning through quizzes around food groups and labelling the human skeleton and in Theme the children used 'Whiteboardfi' to show they knew what happened to each of King Henry's six wives!

A short but busy week! Enjoy the weekend.
