Today we have been spotty and dotty and all things bright as we supported Children In Need. We used assembly time to look at why we support others and to think about the many things that we take for granted. This week has been a busy week for members of our Local Advisory Board (LAB) with the first termly meeting on Monday and yesterday their first visit of this academic year. The LAB has an important role within Colley Lane as it provides support for myself as the Head but also to be a critical friend and give quality assurance of what we as a school are providing for your children. It is always lovely to welcome them into school in their LAB role as even though many of them are parents, they get to look in greater detail at initiatives and ask questions.

The focus of the visit was to look at engagement and behaviour for learning and how we provide challenge for all learners. It started with a presentation from Mrs Oakley, our Teaching and Learning lead into our HIgh Challenge for all approaches to teaching and the techniques that we have worked on to engage pupils in their learning. This ranges from using digital technology to sharing ideas with a buddy to simply allowing thinking time. The LAB members had the opportunity to visit classrooms, and talk to children and staff. It was an incredibly positive visit reflecting the supportive nature of our community. We look forward to the next visit in the Spring Term.

We now have an official "Friends of Colley Lane" group (formerly The PTA) and thank you to everyone who expressed their support and came to the meetings. On Wednesday, the group adopted their official constitution and voted in Joint Chairs, Secretary and Treasurer as well as 3 other committee members. This means that they can now register as a charity if they would like but more importantly start to bring back the events and activities that we have missed as a community. The first plans for events are underway and if you can help out at all or would like to come along, the next Friends meeting is Tuesday 22nd November at 4:45 pm.



Finally this week, Jake and Amelia, our Headboy and Headgirl, represented

# What's been happening in school this week?

# Nursery

We have had a very busy week in Nursery! We have thoroughly enjoyed engaging with World Nursery Rhyme Week, taking part in Bikeability training, wearing our odd socks for anti-bullying week, starting to learn our Christmas songs and celebrating Children in Need with our spots and bright colours!



Throughout this week we have looked at 5 nursery rhymes to celebrate World Nursery Rhyme Week and enjoyed lots of activities within continuous provision around different nursery rhymes. Our focus rhymes this week were The big ship sails, 1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive, 5 little speckled frogs, B.I.N.G.O and twinkle twinkle. We have also enjoyed singing lots of other rhymes throughout the week. On Friday, in praise assembly, we joined in with Reception to perform twinkle, twinkle little star.

In WCR this week we started to learn about our new book. We looked at the differences between night and day, comparing what we could see in the sky. We then looked at the different phases of the moon and how this changes over the month. Finally, we found out that our new book has lots of rhyming words in it so we worked on matching the rhyming couplets together. I wonder what our book might be?



In Phonics this week, we have recapped our previously learnt sounds and learnt our new sound of the week. Our phoneme this week was 't'. We introduced the tiger picture card and played a blending game with the words teeth, tin, tap and top. The children are really enjoying hearing the initial sounds in different words and you can support this at home by emphasising the initial sound in their name.

In maths, we have been working on cardinal values. The children have been counting carefully and using the sentence stem 'I know I have ... because it was the last number I counted'. We practised our careful counting skills using objects and actions and worked hard to stop at the correct number.

We really enjoyed our first bikeability session. We went out onto the key stage 1 playground and practised moving on the balance bike and then played a range of games to encourage us to lift our feet off the floor. We also had lots of races with Kieth! Children will need to wear trainers and have a waterproof coat in school on Wednesday 23th November for their second bikeability session.

# Reception

Reception children have had another busy week in school! They have been communicating clearly, learning new phonics sounds, new words and phrases in their Write Stuff lessons and maths sessions, singing nursery rhymes and new Christmas songs as well as taking part in balance bike sessions! They will need a rest at the weekend ready for next week!

The children have really enjoyed exploring in continuous provision this week using nursery rhymes to support their learning. They have remembered and sang a variety of rhymes and even performed in assembly to KS1. Well done Reception for taking part in World Nursery Rhyme Week.

Even though it was a wet day for their first balance bike session, the children still enjoyed it and took part. Lots of children showed real resilience and courage when learning a new skill and children who were confident supported their peers and enjoyed the races.







In

writing, the children have continued to learn new letter formation rhymes and have tried really hard to control their letter size. Children have been focusing on matching images to initial sounds and searching for letters around the classroom.

They have also learnt the tricky word is. Tricky words are words which can not be sounded out and children need to learn to read these words from sight.

In maths, children have learnt the part part whole model as an introduction to addition. Items are placed in the parts first then moved to the whole to work out how many items there are altogether. Children have been using the language my part is xxx my part is xxx my whole is xxx to develop their understanding. For example, my part is 1, my part is 3, my continuing with this next week so please have a go at home as well.



whole is 4. We will be

In whole class reading, children have started to learn all about goats and bridges. I wonder if your child could predict the book they are going to unwrap next week?

Next week, the children will have their second balance bike session on Thursday so please ensure your child is wearing their PE kit, outdoor shoes and a waterproof coat. There will be no PE on Wednesday. Have a lovely weekend.

# Year 1

Year 1 have had a wonderful week! We started our week supporting Anti-Bullying week by wearing odd socks. It was great seeing all the children proudly showing off their odd socks! We hope you enjoyed our photos and video on Class Dojo! We also celebrated Positive Noticing Day where the children had to look out for wonderful things we did for each other. We linked this to our Aspire Mountain and talked about ways we can be compassionate. The children were so proud to wear their positive tags and it has been lovely seeing the children come to school the following day wearing their tag. Well done Year 1 on being such wonderful friends.

In Literacy we spent the week doing independent writing for our story 'Max and his Wild Adventure'. The children used some wonderful vocabulary to match the relevant lenses for their sentences. They are using their phonics so well and we loved reading their fabulous sentences. Next week we will begin our first non-fiction writing unit which will focus on writing a postcard. If you have any postcards at home you can share

them with your child over the weekend and bring them into school for the children to explore.



In Maths this week we have continued our learning on numbers to 20 looking at comparing numbers using the words 'greatest' and 'smallest'. The children ordered sets of numbers in groups using a range of manipulatives and explained what they did. We even had a visit from Mr Simpson during one lesson and it was wonderful hearing the children explain what they were doing.

We finished our whole class reading book this week, The Enormous Crocodile. The children spent the week 'hot



seating' as the crocodile and predicting what his next 'secret plan and clever trick' would be. We had lots of positive book reviews written by the children and it was clear their first exploration of a Roald Dahl book was a huge hit!

We ended the week learning about Road Safety at our Hive and celebrating Children in Need. Thank you for your donations!

The children have also been practising Christmas songs this week for our forthcoming Christmas event. They are trying really hard to remember the words and we are sure you will enjoy the show which will take place in the morning on Thursday 8th December. More information will be sent out soon.

## Year 2


Year 2 have had another fantastic week of learning! We started the week off in our odd socks to support 'Anti Bullying Week', where we celebrated the children's individuality! They also used the Now Press Play headphones to take part in an experience where they thought about friendship, bullying and how to be kind to each other. This week we have also had 'Positive Noticing Day' where the children created labels for each other, celebrating something nice they had noticed.



Earlier in the week, we were being scientists and exploring the properties of materials, checking if they were stretchy, bendy, squashable and twistable. The children loved investigating how some materials changed shape.

The children have all been working hard in our Geography lessons. This week we have learnt about the 7 <u>continents</u> and 5 <u>oceans</u> in the world and located them on a map. They enjoyed the catchy videos which helped us learn them.

In English, the children have written their own versions of 'If I were in charge of the world'. They had to remember all of the poetic features which we have been rehearsing over the last couple of weeks. It was wonderful to read



their unique ideas! There was lots of excitement this week when we started to read our WCR 'The Dark'. The children have loved learning about Lazlo, our main character and have made predictions about the adventure he will go on.

In Maths, we have been learning about pictograms and block graphs. The children have had to gather and interpret data, answering questions on what they have learnt. As well as reading we would also like the children to start accessing TT Rockstars at home. It will help support them in their understanding of the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Rehearsals for our Christmas play are well underway and it has been lovely to see the children showing off their singing and acting skills. Please can we ask that costumes are in ASAP to ensure we can get the additional accessories ready and that the children continue to practise their lines at home. Year 2's Christmas performance 'A Midwife in Crisis' will be in the morning on Tuesday 13th December. More information will be sent out separately.

We finished our week in our spotty and bright clothes for Children in Need. Thank you all for being so generous and donating lots of coins. Have a wonderful weekend.



# Year 3

Lots going on across the week! Monday saw us all wearing odd socks for Anti-bullying week and recognising and appreciating all of our differences. Wednesday was 'Positive Noticing day' which shone a light on acts of kindness. The children loved receiving their label with an act of kindness written on it. Today, of course is 'Children in need', so lots of bright colours and spots were worn along with Pudsey ears!

Thank you for sending in donations to help raise money for those in need.

English this week has seen us complete our sentence stacking lessons for the explanation text work we have

been doing. The children love to see if their sentence gets to go on the wall! Next week they will be using all their chotting work and shared ideas alongside 'Way points' and 'lenses' to help plan and write their own version of what happens under our feet. Can your child explain what 'Way points' and lenses' are and how they help writing?

In Maths the children have been using a range of strategies when adding and subtracting. They used number lines, partitioning, place value charts, Diennes and the column method to calculate answers. They discovered knowing which multiple of 10 comes before or after a number helps as does knowing number bonds to 10.

The children have loved learning about rivers and oceans in our Geography Theme lessons over the week. They used maps to locate where rivers are across the U.K, know the names of the oceans around our island and found out the names of the parts of a river. Can they tell you what the source is?

In Spanish we made sure we could tell people what our name is, how we are feeling, ask others how they are and can now count 1-12! The children are doing very well! " ¡muy bien!"

The children all bring home a grammar/spelling sheet on a Friday to help consolidate their class learning. They do not need to bring it back to school. Keep using TTRS and Edshed as well as reading!

# Year 4

There have been lots of interesting things going on in Year 4 this week. Firstly, children enjoyed wearing their odd socks on Monday. We had whole-class discussions about the importance of kindness and celebrating differences. On Wednesday, we also had a Positive Message day which involved each child sending a message to a peer.

During our writing lessons, children have been busy planning and writing their independent work about Stonehenge. As part of the week, they have edited and improved their work. Children are very proud of what they've written, as are the teachers. Well done to all!

During our maths lessons, we have recapped key skills from units 1, 2 and 3. This has been a valuable process and children have felt increasingly confident as the week progressed. During theme, we have used grid references and eight compass points to find and locate landmarks.

We had lots of fun during science which included exploring our playgrounds to find leaves from a checklist and we also discussed which minibeasts might live on our school grounds.

This week's spellings have been shared on Class Dojo and are live on EdShed. They are words with the suffix 'ation'.

## Year 5

This week has yet again been another wonderful one, with lots happening every day. Our newest event this week was swimming! We started our Year 5 swimming lessons on Tuesday morning - the pupils were outstanding, with all of them trying their best during their initial assessments. Lots of the children faced their fears and demonstrated their resilience and determination to succeed. Well done Year 5 on your first week of swimming!

In Whole Class Reading, we have continued on with our new book 'Holes' by Louis Sachar. The children are loving the storyline, learning about life at a juvenile detention centre in the desert of Texas. We can't wait to find out what happens next! In Writing, we have continued through our sentence stacking lessons relating to the journey of Captain Robert Scott to the South Pole. We have been thinking about different experiences Scott and

his team faced during their journey across the Antarctic. He really did go through so much.

In Science, we have continued our topic of Space. This week, we investigated how the seasons of the year are created, exploring how the rotation of the Earth around the Sun affects the amount of light in each season and how the weather is affected. We really enjoyed learning about how the world works!

In Theme this week, we have delved further into our new geography topic about the world. We have looked at compass points and Ordnance Survey maps, as well as beginning to explore 4 figure grid references. All of these skills will continue to help us build our map work knowledge. What a great way to begin our topic!

## Year 6


In Year 6 we have been having a lovely time this week learning about the layers of the rainforests. Here are the facts the children researched and underneath are some amazing posters that represent these facts. Why not quiz your child on this information to see if they were being active in their learning?

Emergent Layer - very sunny because it is the very top. Only the tallest trees reach this level. Who lives here? birds, butterflies and small monkeys live with bats, snakes and bugs.

Canopy Layer - much of the rain is stopped by the thick foliage. Most trees in the forest grow to this height. There are plants that grow in the canopy layer. Their roots don't reach the ground. These are called air plants. Who lives here? birds, monkeys, frogs, and sloths, as well as lizards, snakes and many insects.

Understory Layer - many vines, dense vegetation, not much light. Who lives here? birds, butterflies, frogs and snakes

Forest Floor - dark, damp, full of many dead leaves, twigs and dead plants. The forest floor is dark due to the trees above stopping the sunlight from entering the forest. It is estimated that only 2% of the sunlight actually reaches the floor. Who lives here? jaguars in South America, gorillas and leopards in Africa and tapirs and tigers and elephants in Asia.







In Science, we learnt about how the eye actually sees light once it reaches the eye. We labelled an eye diagram and we wrote definitions for each part of the eye.

We have had a huge focus on PSHE this week. Firstly, It was anti-bullying week this week in school and children wore odd socks to help raise awareness of the event. In addition, it was also Positive Noticing Day on Wednesday where children tagged a child with a positive message. Many of the children wrote some deep and amazing words about children that they do not normally work or play with, which was great to see. They also wrote kind words about adults in Year 6 too!
