What's been happening in school this week?

<u>Nursery</u>

It was lovely to see so many parents on Tuesday and discuss your child's progress with you. The children were very eager to be at Nursery and see their friends again on Wednesday!

In maths this week we have been looking at sequencing a series of events and the children have been encouraged to use key words such as first, then, next and last. As a fun test of their new skills the children worked together to sequence how to make a jam sandwich and had to explain the sequence to the teachers so that they could make and eat their



sandwich!



Reception children have started to explore their new theme Spring and Easter. They have really enjoyed playing with the Easter eggs and listening to Spring and Easter stories.

They have also had the opportunity to be creative, one of our Aspire character values, through completing observational drawings and

creating transient Easter egg art.







<u>Year 1</u>

This week the children have continued planning their report writing task all about spiders - and what better way to do that then have a visit from a spider! Cuddles the Tarantula made a surprise visit to Year 1 to inspire the children in their writing. The children were excited to be up close to one of nature's most fascinating minibeasts. We had wonderful discussions and some




brilliant writing! Well done Year 1!



<u>Year 2</u>

This week the children in Year 2 have been very busy writing character descriptions for three horrible crooks; Boggis, Bunce and Bean. They have carefully chosen effective language to portray how evil these farmers are. The children loved creating similes to also add that extra detail, thinking about how plump, tiny or skinny the farmer was. The children can't wait to share these with you at parent's evening next week.



<u>Year 3</u>

Lots of creativity in Year Three this week. The children have been creative in their writing through planning and writing their twist on the traditional tale of 'The Three Little Pigs' - the children enjoyed sending the wolf to prison!

The creativity will continue next week when we will be reading and writing our own Cinquain poems celebrating the importance of plants and the Earth.



As you may have seen on dojo the children have also been learning how to use the primary colours of red, yellow and blue to create secondary colours. They enjoyed trying out the colour combinations to create their colour wheel. They will

be using these skills next week to paint pictures of the endangered sea turtle. Shades of blues, greens and browns will be needed to help create the turtle and the ocean.

Creativity continued with the children beginning to make their Easter or Ramadan cards through drawing and printing. We've had a creative week in Year 4. This has included creative writing in English, singing and songwriting with our visiting musician (as part of our special music project) and also in our art lessons.

<u>Year 4</u>



In our art, children have explored the work of African artist Edward Tingatinga and have created their own paintings influenced by his style and techniques. Children have planned the background scene and also



created their own patterns to decorate the animals.

In our music lesson, we've added verses to the song we started collaborating on a few weeks ago.

We will be attending

a special music concert on 15th June. Further details about this will follow next term.

<u>Year 5</u>

This week has been another lovely one with the children.

Our most exciting lesson this week was related to Theme. We have been looking into 'Sustainability' what this means and the impact we

are having upon our planet. The children researched a number of sustainable artists and creators who utilise recycled materials to create their artwork and installations.





Using these as inspiration, we began to create our own recycled materials pieces using the bottle tops that have been collected. We painted the backgrounds of the canvas and began to assemble the bottle tops on the canvases.

<u>Year 6</u>

This week, we have been continuing the fun Science activities from Science Week. The children have really enjoyed the practical activities over the last few weeks. We created an investigation that shows how blood is pumped around the body. We have covered so much content on the heart this term that I am sure they will pass the assessment for this unit with flying colours!

<u>Ramadan</u>

With Ramadan approaching we have put in place provisions for our Muslim pupils that wish to fast at school.

At lunch times if your child requires some quiet time then they are welcome to sit quietly in the library to read a book or to use their ipads.

If they would like to perform the dhur prayer then they can use the spare 4A classroom next to the staff room which will be supervised.

Finally we wish all of our Muslim pupils and Community a Blessed and Happy Ramadan.
