

What's been happening in school this week?

<u>Nursery</u>

What a wonderful week we have had in Nursery! The children have been working really hard on their Christmas nativity songs and all really enjoyed their second balance bike session on Wednesday.

This week we started our new topic all about sports and the World Cup. The children have enjoyed looking at the different sports that we can play and talking about the sports they enjoy. On Monday afternoon children had the opportunity to watch England in their first World Cup game while choosing in the Nursery classroom. They have had the opportunity to explore the different countries who are taking part in the World Cup through colouring the different flags, play a game of football with the small world characters and practise their pre-writing skills by completing pencil control sheets.



In WCR this week we found out that our new book is Goodnight Moon. We learnt some of the key vocabulary from the book and enjoyed looking at the rhyming words throughout the story. After we had read the book the children spoke about who they say goodnight to when they go to bed.

In Phonics this week, we have recapped our previously learnt sounds and learnt our new sound of the week. Our phoneme this week was 'p'. We introduced the penguin picture card and played a blending game with the words pen, pin, pan and pig. The children are really enjoying hearing the initial sounds in different words and you can support this at home by emphasising the initial sound in their name or everyday items.

In maths, we have started to look at 2D shapes. This week we have been focussing on circle and triangle. The children have been introduced to the vocabulary sides, corners and vertices to describe each shape. We have also been looking for circles and triangles within the Nursery setting.

This week you should've received a letter with details for the Christmas production and the costume which your child requires. Please ensure costumes are handed into school in a labelled bag no later than Wednesday 7th December.

<u>Reception</u>

Well done to all Reception for completing their balance bike ability training. This week the children had the chance to develop and refine their cycling skills. Well done Reception!

The children have really enjoyed playing cooperative games this week where they have developed their turn taking skills. It has been lovely to watch children taking turns with their friends without adult intervention.

In maths, children have continued to learn about addition using a part part whole diagram. This week they have focused on the pictorial part and have had the opportunity to draw their own items in the parts and then the whole to find the total. They have also continued to develop their knowledge of 1 more than.

In Whole Class Reading, children unwrapped their new story, The Three Billy Goats Gruff. Children really enjoyed joining in with the repetitive phrases and ordered images from the story as a group. The children were asked a number of why and how do you know questions when ordering the story to develop their understanding.



In phonics, children have been revisiting previous sounds and a new phonics sheet has been uploaded to their dojo portfolio. They have enjoyed taking part in the numerous phonics and writing activities offered this week which have focused on letter recognition, initial sounds and blending to read and segmenting to spell.

The children have also learnt the tricky words the and I. Next week they will be searching for these words around the classroom and continuing to practise their letter formation.

This week your child would have taken home a costume letter for their Christmas production. Please ensure costumes are handed into school in a labelled bag no later than Wednesday 7th December.

<u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 have had a busy week with Assessments and we couldn't be more proud of how hard the children have tried. True to our Aspire values, they showed wonderful courage and resilience and gave it their best, well done



Year 1.

In English we have begun our first non-fiction unit and the children were excited to be working on a much loved Julia Donaldson classic, The Snail and the Whale. As part of the unit the children have been learning about postcards and have loved looking at a map of the world and telling us where they have been on holiday. They have begun exploring and writing the key features of a postcard and as always, the children have excelled in their writing by adding some wonderful descriptive vocabulary in their sentences.

The children's excitement over a new book continued in whole class reading

when we unveiled our new book, The Jolly Postman. In the run up to the grand unveiling the children spent some time exploring the ins and outs of the postal system and also had a go at writing a letter from Goldilocks to the Three Bears. You can imagine their surprise when they came across an actual letter from Goldilocks to the Three Bears in the Jolly Postman book! Look at the children using their Phonics to read the letter!

This week we launched the Big Cat E-book library and we hope you have found it easy to navigate. We would encourage you to spend some time each week hearing your child read their assigned book



and write a comment in their reading record. Thank you for your engagement with this and if you have any questions please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher.

Finally we have been practising our Christmas singing this week and are looking forward to performing the songs in our Christmas Craft and Singing event on Thursday 8th December. We hope you can join us!

Year 2 have shown many ASPIRE values this week but have mainly shown their resilience. This week, has been assessment week, where the children have completed different assessment booklets. All of the children rised to the challenges with courage and determination and we are really proud of all of them.

As part of our theme, we have also started to compare Halesowen to Nairobi. The children showed respect and

interest when exploring another place to live, asking super questions and listening carefully when learning new facts. To conclude this theme, the children are invited to come to school on **Tuesday 6th December** dressed in bright, colourful clothes please. We are going to have a carnival themed day full of art, dancing and even some african drumming!

In writing this week, the children have explored the features of a postcard. We loved sharing our new text 'Meerkat Christmas, reading all the different postcards and finding out about his adventures. On Friday, we started looking deeper into the features, starting with the greeting and adventures. The children came up with some fantastic ideas and vocabulary.

This week, we have finished reading our WCR "The Dark". This story has really hooked the children and enabled them to think about their own views of the dark. Next week we will be looking at whether their thoughts have changed since reading this text.

Please can we encourage the children to continue to read their reading book at home and access <u>TT Rockstars</u> again this week, to practise their 2,5 and 10 times table.

Thank you to everyone who has already sent in Christmas play costumes. Can we ask that costumes for the play are in by **Monday 5th December** so we can finalise costumes please. Thank you and we hope you have a lovely weekend all.

Lots of resilience on show in Year Three this week. They have worked really hard completing their reading quizzes, assessments tasks and editing/redrafting of their explanation text in English. Well done everyone!


The children have been enjoying meeting Prince Grogbah, the Barrow goblin in our WCR book. They rather enjoy how rude he is being to the owners of the hotel! Can your child tell you where he wanted to stay instead of the bedroom?

In Science this week we have continued discovering fascinating facts about soil! Last week we looked at and drew soil jars, labelling organic matter, water and the layers of sand, clay and silt. This week we found out that soil has a profile and reflected on how important it is; as a habitat, for growing food and as a way to reduce flood risk, just to name a few.

Geography has seen us learning about mountains. We found out how mountains are formed, studied the heights of mountains in Wales and were able to label a mountain using the correct terminology. The children were surprised to find out a mountain has a face!

In P.E the children used their throwing and catching skills to see whether they could beat the ball being passed around the square! Great teamwork used. They then performed different types of rolls in gymnastics today, again working in a group.

We are starting to learn the Christmas songs for the Carol concert and are looking forward to you hopefully joining us on 13th December. The songs have been sent out on the school dojo so the children can be singing them at home too.













<u>Year 4</u>

Year 4 have worked incredibly hard during our assessment week, showing hard-work and resilience throughout. We will share results with children and will support them in areas to work on ahead of the next assessments in the spring term. Well done to all!

We've had an exciting end to our busy week with the introduction of our Windsor Academy Trust Arts project. Our visiting artist, Paul Wilcox, is working with schools across our Trust and was with Year 4 on Friday. It was a fun and engaging introduction to the project and we are looking forward to our future dates. We have a Trust performance to also look forward to - further details to follow in the spring term.

In reading and theme, we have researched what life is like in Iceland and Italy. In our reading lesson, we read about the volcanoes in Iceland. During theme, we learnt about the different climates of the two countries and developed fact files ahead of our Fantastic Finish project.

In writing, we have started our final project of this term and it centres around Charlie and The Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl. Children will be writing their own section to the story and have even designed their own sweets for Willy Wonka.

<u>Year 5</u>

Year 5 have had a lovely week this week. They have been working incredibly hard through their assessments and have given them their all. We are incredibly impressed by their dedication and resilience throughout!

We had a fabulous week at swimming. All of the children impressed the staff with their skills and responsible attitudes towards learning new strokes and methods in the pool. Mr Simpson came along with us this week and he was so pleased to see how hard the children were working! We are really looking forward to the coming weeks.

In Whole Class Reader this week, we joined our main character Stanley with digging his first hole in the desert. We learnt how hard this was to do and empathised with him when he woke the next day very sore and achy. We can't wait to find out what happens next in the coming story.

In Writing, we completed our final two sentence stacking lessons - we looked at the final adventures of Scott and his team before their demise on their journey home. We understood how courageous the team had been and were incredibly respectful of them, following their deaths only 11 miles from the end of their journey. We have learnt so much during this unit; we look forward to applying our knowledge to our independent writing next week.

In Science this week we had great fun! We investigated the phases of the moon and how the light from the sun acted as a reflection. We looked at the 28 day moon cycle and the four phases of the moon's orbit - full moon, new moon, crescent moon and gibbous moon. We also discussed the terms waxing and waning to understand the difference between them. To test our understanding, we used Oreo biscuits to model the phasing process. This was definitely the children's favourite part! Ask them to show you at home!

In Theme, we studied six figure grid references. These allowed us to read maps accurately and identify locations across Britain and the world. We plotted our points on maps and identified the importance of the x and y axis.

Finally, preparations are underway for the KS2 Christmas Carol Concert this year. All of the songs are available to practise on Class Dojo. We can't wait to perform for you!

<u>Year 6</u>

In Year 6 this week, all classes have been very busy.

We have begun our first rehearsals for the Christmas carol concert with many children setting a great example by joining in the singing and actions! Children are never too old at primary school to be doing this so we are giving out lots of Class Dojos this week for extra effort in singing both in class and in assembly! Watch out children for teachers with their iPads in assembly!

In PE we have all been working towards an end goal in End Ball! End Ball is a prerequisite game before children learn to play netball and we have been honing our throwing and catching skills, defending and attacking skills, and also our general team playing skills. So, for the next few weeks, we will be holding a tournament where all the children will be placed in teams and across the whole year group! We can't wait to see these excellent skills in action!

In Science we have planned an investigation into what happens to shadows throughout the day. We began to make predictions about what happens to your shadow as the sun rises and sets. Children worked in groups to design their own investigation and they showed good team skills to do this. As you can imagine, at this time of year it is hard to find a day with sunshine. Therefore, we will post our results once we have shadows!

In reading, we have come to the end of our book 'Boy, Tales of Childhood' which was a funny, compelling and insightful story about Roald Dahl's life as a young boy. We feel that the children really enjoyed some of the harrowing tales that were told in a humorous way.
