Nursery

We explored the housing and baths in Roman Britain, learning all about how they washed and bathed to keep themselves clean. Our final theme lesson explored the downfall of the Roman Empire; it looked at how the Romans came to an end in Britain as the Anglo-Saxons began to take over.

Firstly, we began our auditioning process for our end of year production. 
