What's been happening in school this week?

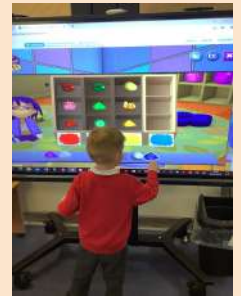
Nursery

What a super week we have had in Nursery! The children have really enjoyed learning all about Autumn. We have a lot of natural Autumnal resources in our indoor and outdoor classrooms which the children have enjoyed exploring. We have been learning new vocabulary such as pinecone, conker and acorn as well as encouraging descriptive language such as spiky, shiny and smooth. On Thursday all of the children enjoyed a walk in The Glade where we looked to see the signs of Autumn in the trees. The children were using some great language to describe the different colours, sizes and appearances of the different leaves and sticks.



This week in WCR we have started to look at our new story. The children have found out that our new story has something to do with the zoo and that within the story we will meet a lion, camel, elephant, giraffe, monkey, dog, frog and snake. We have also introduced the children to some of the key language used to describe the animals within the text such as, jumpy, fierce and tall. The children are very excited to reveal our new book next week, I wonder what it might be?

In Maths this week, we have started to look at sorting objects by one attribute. This week we have been focussing on sorting objects by their colour. The children were challenged to sort a box objects into the right groups, have found objects from around the room to sort into coloured groups and have played a game on the interactive whiteboard where they have to sort coloured gems into the correct boxes. You could support this at home by asking your child to tidy their toys away a colour at a time or splitting their blocks into different colour groups. This will support their colour recognition as well as their maths skills.

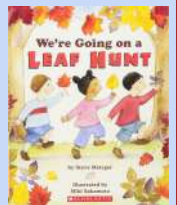

Reception

Reception children have had a great week exploring all things Autumn! They have been using new words to describe the weather like blustery, foggy, frosty, gusty and chilly. Encourage your child to use these words at home when talking about the weather.

Next week each class will be going on a 'Leaf Hunt' around school inspired by the story We're Going on a Leaf Hunt. Children will be accessing spaces on our school site for around 1 hour. **RR will need to bring in a coat and wellington boots on Thursday 6th October and RTW will need to bring in a coat and wellington boots on Friday 7th October.**



In maths children have been grouping items and stating which group has the fewest and which has the most.

The children also had their first Doh Disco session this week. Each child has their own pot of playdoh and are encouraged to follow along to different actions and songs. Doh Disco helps to strengthen hand muscles ready for writing and drawing.

The children have also focused on kind hands, kind feet and kind words this week. We have talked about how kind hands make other people feel happy and how we can make good choices at school. We have lots of emotions books in school which you can borrow to read with your child at home.

Year 1

We've had a very busy week in Year 1. The children have worked so hard and have had lots of fun! The highlight of our week definitely came at the end of our whole class reading session for our book Rosie Revere Engineer. The children followed instructions superbly as they made their own drop copters. They tested them in class before thinking of ways to make them better. Some children chose to add additional creative resources to their drop copters



before testing them outside. Such was the interest in the drop copters, some children chose to make their own at home! We loved exploring Rosie Revere Engineer and can't wait to see where our next whole class reading book will take us!

In English the children have continued to work on writing sentences as part of our Write Stuff unit on the story The Proudest Blue. We have enjoyed bringing our lessons to life through exploring artefacts and drama sessions. The children have also enjoyed coming up with interesting vocabulary with the help of Grandma Fantastic who brings wonderful words to our lessons.



In Maths this week we have explored the properties of 2D shapes looking at sides and corners. We have also begun to look at addition and have used number lines and number tracks to explore counting on.

Thank you to all children who have returned their Phonics home learning sheet or uploaded their work onto Class Dojo. Look out for this week's sheet which continues to consolidate our Phase 3 and 4 Phonics learning.

Year 2

We've had another fantastic week in Year 2, delving deeper into our 'Will we ever get to Mars?' theme by exploring the achievements of both Tim Peake and Neil Armstrong. We thought about the questions we would like to ask the astronauts, as well as watching clips of them living in space.



We have been learning about the emotion 'happiness'. We have been thinking about what makes us happy and signs that we are happy. When we spoke about the things that made us happy, we noticed we had big smiles on our faces. We also discovered that music and dancing can increase our mood and make us smile.



In science, we have been working scientifically. This week, we had some skittles and we poured warm water over them. We watched as the sugar dissolved and a skittles' rainbow was made. We made some excellent predictions about what might happen.

We are also really enjoying Beegu, our whole class reading text and were really eager to learn more about our main character. In our writing lessons, we have continued our story 'The Way Back Home', where we have written about how the boy has crashed suddenly on the moon because he ran out of petrol!

Year 3

We have been historical detectives in Theme this week, continuing on our journey through the Victorian era. This week the children have been learning about Isambard Kingdom Brunel and the impact his designs and constructions (ships, bridges and tunnels) had during the 19th century.



In Science the children worked collaboratively to discover what was hidden under the sand and then decided how to classify the rocks they revealed. A practical start to our new topic of 'Rocks and soils'.

In Music we found out what 'pitch', 'timbre' and 'dynamics' meant regarding a piece of music. Can they still remember?! We listened to a piece of orchestral music and drew the images the instruments helped us to create in our minds. The timbre really helped with mood!

The theme of 'mood' continued in our writing this week too. Tom, our character is very puzzled and confused about the star he has found. His mood was represented by the night garden he was peering out into today. The children collected negative verbs to suit the behaviour of natural objects in the garden indicating how Tom was feeling. Good 'chotting' everyone! That's chatting and jotting!

In Maths we have been exploring strategies to use when adding and subtracting. We have partitioned numbers into tens and ones and used number lines to jump forwards and backwards. Keep working on number bonds children - ways to make 10 and 100. If we know $2 + 8 = 10$, we can use $20 + 80$ to equal 100.

We have been finding out a lot more about the BFG this week. We know what he eats, what he collects and that he speaks in a rather odd way! The children are enjoying Sophie's adventure so far.

The children have been quizzing over the week on the ipads when they have completed their AR book and hopefully had a good discussion about it with you at home.

Top tips for the children: Don't rush your reading to get to a quiz. Talk about your book to an adult. Make sure you understand the plot, characters and any unfamiliar vocabulary - especially if you have a nonfiction book when vocabulary may be technical.

Year 4

We've been very busy this week in Year 4. We've linked our reading, writing, theme and art lessons together and all around the topic of the Stone Age. It has been fantastic to see and hear children share their writing also linked to our focus book: Stone Age Boy. As each lesson progresses so too does the childrens' writing confidence. Year 4 staff are already excited at the prospect of reading the childrens' independent writing at the end of this project. It is going to be good, we can feel it already. We shall look forward to sharing their successes during Parents Evenings and also via Class Dojo. Children will also have the opportunity to photograph their work on their iPads so they are able to share with family members.

During our maths lessons this week, we started a new unit block: addition and subtraction. This has already proved to be successful as children have shown that they can add and subtract using appropriate strategies, which will be useful throughout Year 4 and will be built on during the next two years in school. It is really positive so we shall look forward to this continuing.

Homework tasks

- Weekly spellings are set each Tuesday (after the children have been introduced and learnt the spell rules during their weekly SPaG lesson). Each spelling assignment will be set on EdShed - Spelling Shed.
- Our first TT Rockstars battle begins today. This week it is 4A vs 4H. Who will win?
- Home reading. Lots of children have been reading regularly already this year and have successfully completed their reading quizzes. Reading books should go home each day and should be returned to school the next day so children can read their books as part of their daily timetable and also read to an adult.

Year 5

What a wonderful week we have had in Year 5; it has been a busy one but certainly full of fun!

To begin, in Reading this week, the children have been working through the first chapters of 'Danny the Champion of the World' by Roald Dahl. They are loving the book and really have taken to the character of Danny. The children have been exploring the book's themes of poaching and the impact it has. They can't wait to continue reading the book next week.

In Writing, the children have continued to explore the book 'Gorilla' by Anthony Browne and have been constructing sentences incorporating skills such as dialogue, similes, onomatopoeia and semicolons. They have been working incredibly hard to understand the structure of their new lessons and are really beginning to grasp the contexts of 'chotting' (chatting and jotting to create vocabulary lists) and 'kind calling out' (feeding back ideas with putting their hands up). We are incredibly proud of everything they have achieved this week and are looking forward to seeing what next week brings.

In Theme this week, the children explored the Ancient Greek Gods and Goddesses. The children thoroughly enjoyed exploring these new and exciting individuals who lived on Mount Olympus and created outstanding fact files to go alongside these. Their second lesson of Theme looked at what life was like for an Ancient Greek, exploring housing, food, clothing and schooling. The children were shocked to find out that only boys went to school! We are so excited to see what our next lesson about The Ancient Greeks brings. Finally, in Science, the children conducted another exciting experiment using torches. They investigated light and shadows, measuring the shadows in relation to the distance of the light. The children had so much fun!

Just a quick reminder about our upcoming trip to the National Space Centre. We are so excited to take the children to Leicester and can't wait to make lots of amazing memories. Payment for this can be made via ParentMail and if you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to ask a member of the Year 5 team.

Year 6

Children in Year 6 have been learning this week about the Art of Happiness and how to approach life with a positive mindset. We looked at how we can look at a situation in learning that might be tricky and think of a way to get better at that particular learning. In fact, we learned that to be really great at something, you need to practise, practise, practise. Experts in their field have taken many hours of practice to be the best! We are aiming to be an Outstandingly Happy School and the children in Year 6 spreading happiness is part of that journey. Each week, on this part of the newsletter, I will share an activity, thought or just a phrase that you can talk about with your children or your child can talk to you about it! (Brilliant Me) In addition, the Head Boy and Girl along with their deputies will be helping to spread the joy of happiness across the school. Ask your child about the Brill-o-Pad they wrote on during our day. What does it mean? What did they have to write on there? This week's Brilliant Me is, 'Give up screen time for 24 hours. Write a log of what you did instead'. I wonder who can manage this?

This week, we have been distributing prefect roles to those that applied. All children chosen will receive a prefect badge and will be shining examples of how to behave in Year 6. Roles we have distributed include; librarians, playground leaders, corridor monitors, register monitors, assembly monitors etc. Good luck to all pupils starting their role next week! Most children have roles and responsibilities but if they do not and they would like one, they can talk to their teacher who will be able to help.

Within English this week, we have begun to answer comprehension questions about Roald Dahl and Egyptian Gods in the style of SAT questions. We have also continued to read our book, Boy. In writing, we have continued to write in our new style of writing by creating lists of fantastic vocabulary through chotting (chatting and jotting) and then using these words within our work. We have created some beautiful sentences together and the teacher chooses three sentences from three different pupils which are placed on the wall with the child's picture next to the writing to show whose amazing writing it is!

In theme, the children have worked extremely hard to work in groups to investigate life in Ancient Egyptian times. Children learned about rulers, farming, housing, clothing etc using their iPads.
