# What's been happening in school this week?

## <u>Nursery</u>

What an exciting week it has been in Nursery! On Monday evening Mrs Silvers brought us a special delivery from the office which we were able to open on

Tuesday. Inside the box we found two pots of baby caterpillars! We are very excited to watch the caterpillar grow and become beautiful butterflies which we can set free!



This week, we have also started to look at our new whole class reading text. We started by speaking about how different things grow and thinking about how we have grown from a baby into children and will continue to grow into an adult. The children then looked at how plants grow before going outside to plant their very own bean which we will be taking care of and observing growing.

Just a reminder that Nursery will be closed on Tuesday 19th March due to parents meetings taking place all day.



### <u>Year 1</u>

It has been another busy week in Year One!

We came back, after the weekend, to find our bean plants had started to grow, which was very exciting.

On Tuesday we visited the library and shared some books on weather to help us learn more about our theme work.



It has also been Science week, so we had an extra science lesson, when we found out about the life cycle of a frog. The children learnt that metamorphosis means

## <u>Reception</u>

Reception have started to learn all about Spring and the celebration of Easter.

They have immersed themselves in their new provision and even planted some beans! The children talked about new life and new growth linked to Easter and Spring whilst planting.

Next week, reception will be visiting St Peter's Church, please see letter on dojo and on parent mail. They will also be visiting the library Wednesday afternoon.

What a lot of science we have done this week in Year two as part of science week. We looked at whether different fruit changes the way jelly sets. We found out that fresh pineapple causes the jelly not to set whereas tinned pineapple

doesn't. We learnt about fair tests and controls in science experiments.

We have also been looking at habitats and how different animals live in different habitats and why.









We played a great game which involved the children pretending to be frogspawn but could only turn into a tadpole by winning a game of rock, paper, scissors! They then had to win another game to turn into a froglet and then a

frog. It was quite hectic but the classroom was soon filled with the sound of lots of children "ribbiting" around the classroom!

Finally we have been looking at food chains. We learnt that green plants make their own food whereas animals can't. So they eat either plants or animals or sometimes both. We decided that if one thing was taken out of the food chain there would be problems! We have loved being scientists!

## <u>Year 3</u>

Year Three have been working collaboratively in D.T this half term to create their

endangered animal out of recyclable materials.

They had to research, plan, select resources and tools, assemble and paint their animals.





Finally they worked together to use a cam and crank to make the animal's tongue stick in and out!

We have been displaying them for Year Two to come and see!







It has been another great week in Year 4!



We started off the week with some art focusing our skills on finer details in our sketches. We first looked at some photographs of different insects before sketching them in our books and

adding in detail and colour. There were some fantastic drawings!

In Science this week, we have been learning about the water cycle and the children created their own using dyed water and ziploc bags. The children have taken these home and will observe what happens over time. I wonder what we will see?





On Wednesday we had the privilege of having a dance workshop where the children focused on the hip hop dance style and put together a final performance to the Mission

Impossible music. The children worked so well as a team and their behaviour was outstanding.

We look forward to seeing you next week. Have a lovely weekend.

## Year 5

Year 5 have worked incredibly hard this week on the assessments - they have shown fantastic resilience, determination and effort in every area.

This week, we have completed lots of Science lessons for British Science Week. We have investigated the life cycle of mammals and how this is really important to prevent extinction; we have discovered how pollination occurs within plants and how vital this is to ensure the continuation of the ecosystem; finally, we have explored hand washing and the impact of germs on our health if we don't clean our hands regularly. What a fab way to enjoy Science week.

In Theme, we have continued our journey with Rivers. We have looked at the journey they make from the source to the mouth of a river and have investigated the differences between rivers and canals.

We have had another fabulous week and we are looking forward to our final one together before Easter.

## Year 6

It has been a busy week in Year 6 now we are getting on with our learning after the mock SATs.

Lots of children joined the SATs club with Mr Scarth and Mrs Oakley which is open to all children from 8:20a.m everyday after Easter up until SATs. Miss Rigley is doing the same but at lunch times on Mondays and Fridays and in Miss Rigley's sessions, children can complete their homework too.

This week, parents were invited to a SATs meeting and if you couldn't make it, the slides are posted on Class Dojo. Please read them carefully as there is lots of important information on there that you need to know. The most important being that SATs Week is from Monday 13th May - Thursday 16th May and that all children need to be in school every day.

In school, children have participated in Science week. We followed our main Science lesson which was learning about Carl Linneus and his classification system. Secondly, we took part in a messy investigation where we

learned about what happens to particles when we breathe them in by using pasta, rice, chickpeas and sand as the different



particles and different sized sieves acting as our airwaves.








## C<u>lub News</u>

# <u>MMR Clinics</u>

There are new measles vaccination clinics every Saturday in March in Brierley Hill and also at additional locations across the borough. These will be offering free measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) immunisation to children aged from 3 years and 4 months and anyone born from 1970 onwards. Appointments do not need to be booked. People can just turn up on the day. These clinics are a great opportunity for easier access to immunisation for those who haven't received 2 doses of their MMR vaccine.
