Reading Review

Yesterday we welcomed Mrs Hayes, Head of School Evaluation and Assurance from Windsor Academy Trust, who came to look at reading and phonics across the school. She was very impressed with how the children approached reading, using their phonic knowledge to decode harder words and other strategies to read new texts but also the interventions that are in place to support all levels of reading ability. It was clear to see that since we introduced Little-Wandle two years ago how the outcomes and progress in reading have improved. This is also down to the support from parents with reading at home. Being able to read fluently is so important for all areas of the curriculum but also to support children's self-esteem and confidence. As Dr Suess said:

"The more that you read, the more things you will know.
The more that you learn, the more places you will go"

With World Book Day next week, we are having a renewed focus on home reading. The children have been shown a Home reader/Boom Reader dojo reward point (2 points!) today that they can achieve each time they read with someone at home and the home diary is completed. The simple habit of stopping to share a story or book everyday, even for just 5 minutes, is a wonderful thing.

This week in WCR and our writing lessons the children have been learning all about the




farmers Boggis, Bunce and Bean. The children have

In geography, we were looking at weather in the UK. We created windsocks and took them outside to see which direction the wind was blowing in! What a great week!








had to get creative with their adjectives to describe both their personality traits and physical features.

Uffington White Horse in




the sand and constructed StoneHenge, Hadrian's Wall and Severn Bridge out of playdough and lego.

The children loved looking at all the books and chose one to borrow to take home to enjoy.


In the afternoon, in Geography, the children found out about landmarks across Europe and made their own Top

We started our week with Geography where we learnt all about the different plate boundaries, building on last week's knowledge. We conducted a practical, using oreos to show

how different plate boundaries work.



In Science, we carried out an investigation over time by watching what happens when chocolate is placed in tubs of different temperature water.

The children were able to explain that some materials have the ability to change from one state to another through the processes of heating and freezing.



Year 4 also had an afternoon where the local fire service came to visit and give a very important talk all about fire safety and what to do in the event of a fire. The children learnt a lot of interesting facts including 'Stop', 'Drop'

and 'Roll'. The children also learnt about the importance of having smoke alarms in households- if
