What's been happening in school this week?

<u>Nursery</u>

We have had a lovely week in Nursery learning all about Chinese New Year. The children have enjoyed watching videos of the lion and dragon dancing which takes place during the celebrations and using the whiteboard to colour in their own lions and lanterns.

We spoke about how Chinese

New Year is celebrated and why it is important to some people. The children all listened well and enjoyed watching a video about The Great Race.

The children have also enjoyed learning about 3D shapes in maths. They have been introduced to a range of vocabulary and have been on shape hunts in the Nursery garden!

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<u>Year 1</u>

We've had a wonderful first week back in Year 1. The children have come back full of enthusiasm and eager to learn!

We launched our new Geography theme this week all



about weather! The children explored weather symbols and completed a task matching symbols and labels. We then explored the work of meteorologists and looked at the different instruments they use to help them make predictions about the weather, before watching

a weather forecast. The children then teamed up with a partner to deliver their own weather forecast with many children

<u>Reception</u>

What a brilliant week we have had back in Reception! This week we had two new friends join Reception - our new pet fish! The children were very excited to meet the fish and have the task of giving them names. We cannot wait to



hear all their great ideas! Don't forget to remind the children to send back in their entry forms with their name ideas.

The children have continued to explore our Chinese New year provision and discovered all the different traditions of this celebration. They have also enjoyed learning how to write chinese letters and numbers!



What a busy first week back we have had in Year 2!

We began our new geography theme all about The United Kingdom. We reminded ourselves of the 4 counties and their capital cities and learnt about the 4 bodies of water surrounding the UK. We used an atlas to help us locate these. We found out what a compass is used for and the different compass points. Ask us our favourite mnemonic for remembering them.We used Now Press Play to consolidate our learning and went on a mission around the 4 counties





predicting snow in England! Now that would be an unexpected treat!

to find the missing King Charles. We flew in a helicopter around the United Kingdom,over the North and Irish Sea. We found national symbols from each of the countries.

We took a closer look at London and some of the famous landmarks. Using our knowledge of a compass, we then directed ourselves around a map of London and the landmarks using directional language. We will continue to explore England and other landmarks next week.

<u>Year 3</u>

Lots of new knowledge to take on board this week in Year Three! The children are loving studying Europe which is our new topic this half term in Geography.

They have found out and can order, according to size, all seven continents. They know a catchy song to help them remember!



The children have been learning ab



learning about physical features and researched facts about the Dolomites and the Alps. They used QR codes to see the mountain ranges and were fascinated

to hear about the city-states in Europe of the Vatican city and Monaco.

Lots of lovely speaking and listening hearing about the different European countries the children have visited and how they differ to England.

<u>Year 4</u>

What a lovely first week back Year 4 has had this week.

We began the week with some British Values and understanding what 'Individual Liberty' means. The

children then showcased their individuality by creating their own portrait of themselves along with words they felt described them. We then put these around our classroom door to create a colourful patchwork piece celebrating all our uniqueness!





We have been delving deep into our new Geography topic all about Natural Disasters and

have been learning about tectonic plates and the different plate boundaries that can occur and how these can lead to earthquakes, tsunamis and volcanoes.

We also had the lovely opportunity to go to the library and collect a new book as well as hear a lovely extract from Beowulf.



<u>Year 5</u>

Year 5 have had a lovely first week back after half term. The children's attitudes to learning are exemplary and we are incredibly proud of them.

This week started with our PSHE morning. We explored the work of Nelson Mandela and discussed the importance of his actions. We also debated whether Nelson Mandela should or should not have been imprisoned for fighting against segregation. Make sure you ask the children what they thought about this.

In Theme we began our new Geography topic, Rivers. We began this week by investigating water cycles - we explored why the water cycle is such an important part of our planet's survival and how it works. The children were fantastic, using key vocabulary such as evaporation, condensation and precipitation to describe the process.

Finally this week, we completed the last few chapters of Alice's Adventures in Wonderland, our class reader. The children absolutely loved this book and it was so fantastic to see their engagement in this. We celebrated the end of our book with our Alice in Wonderland Day on Friday. The children looked amazing in their costumes and thoroughly enjoyed the activities they did around the book.
