As it has been anti-bullying week this week, we have been doing lots of activities based around kindness, positivity and compassion. As a school, we use the acronym STOP (Several Times On Purpose) to best understand what bullying is and what we need to do is Start Telling Other People.



On Monday, we had an assembly all about how we can colour our world with kindness through helping others and making them smile. Kindness is contagious and once one person spreads kindness, we all want to spread it!

We had a positive noticing day on Wednesday this week where all children had to write some kind words, a compliment or just something positive to give to another child/adult in their class on a brown tag which they could then attach to themselves to take home.



We have also taken part in an anti-bullying competition where the children have had to design their own anti-bullying hero and label their hero with a name alongside what characteristics they possess which help to combat bullying. Some hero designs have had big feet, to 'stomp away' the bullies and negativity- some super ideas! Winning designs will be sent off in the hopes of winning a £100 voucher for the school.
