What's been happening in school this week?

<u>Nursery</u>

We have been working really hard on our physical development in Nursery this week.

During P.E. we used the wooden climbing frame to work on our agility and climbing skills. Then on Wednesday we took part in our first session of Bikeability. The children showed great resilience and courage with the new challenges!





<u>Reception</u>

Reception have really enjoyed their balance bike sessions this week. They listened well to the instructors and showed good balance and coordination.

Children who experienced balance bikes last year in nursery were challenged to improve their technique.

Next week we are learning about Autumn, it would be great if you could bring in leaves, conkers, acorns and sticks etc. for our exploration area.

Also please keep bringing in family photos for children to share. You do not need to print them, you can message a photo to your child's class teacher.

<u>Year 1</u>

This week we started our new whole class reading book - Rosie Revere Engineer. We have spent some time thinking about what it is to be an engineer and the skills they need.

We have discovered that in our book,

Rosie is not feeling very resilient or courageous, so the children have been thinking of ways to encourage her. We had some lovely ideas from the children, such as "don't give up!" " be brave!" and "keep going!"

ROSIE REVERES ENGINEER <u>Year 2</u>

This week we have continued our space focus in writing, art and theme. We have started our story writing based on Jane Considine's unit 'The Way Back Home' and have reminded ourselves of the skills chotting, kind calling out and auditing. We can't wait to see what happens next in the story. In our theme lessons, we began with our big question 'Will we ever visit Mars?' We learnt about our first significant person, Elon Musk and how he wants to visit Mars in the

future. We thought about what space travel might look like in the future and learnt about Falcon 9. We continued to look at Elon Musk in art as we practised different line techniques and used this to draw a half portrait of Elon Musk. I wonder who our



next significant person will be next week!

<u>Year 3</u>

Lots going on across the week in Year Three. The children have continued to find out about the Victorian era in Theme.



Last week they were fascinated by the artefacts we brought into school from Haden Hill House.

The children loved dressing up,

using the carpet beater to clean the rug, turn the mangle

and pretend to wash the clothes in the metal tub with the wooden 'dolly'. To be able to set up a 'museum' for them in school really allowed the children to see how different life was in the home then. They asked some great



questions and enjoyed using their ipads to research some of the answers.

This week we have been looking at chronology and plotting the period on a timeline.

We have continued being curious in Science and this week we wanted to find out whether putting a coat on a snowman would make him melt quicker?! Can your child recall what happened to our ice cube snowman and why? Good observation and measuring skills on show.

<u>Year 5</u>

We've had another lovely week in Year 5, enjoying a great range of different activities in lots of different subjects.

This week, we started our new Whole Class Reader book, 'Danny the Champion of the World'. The children have loved getting to know Danny (our main character) and have shown fantastic engagement in the story line as it links back to previous books they have read, including The BFG. We can't wait to continue reading it next week!

In Theme, we have been exploring the historical timeline of the Ancient Greeks as well as learning the Greek language. The children learnt how to say basic phrases

<u>Year 4</u>



It has been another super week in Year 4. The children have really been immersing themselves in our Prehistory theme, learning about how homes changed throughout the Paleolithic, Mesolithic and

Neolithic times as well as researching facts about the materials which would have been used in everyday life during the Stone Age. We also used our iPads to explore a virtual museum where the children explored different artefacts from the Stone,Bronze and Iron Ages.



We are currently reading 'James and the Giant Peach' in our reading lessons and the children are absolutely loving the plot so far. Our main character, James has made his way inside a giant peach and has come face to face with human sized talking insects! We cannot wait to find out what happens next.

Wow! Year 6's Ancient Egyptian workshop has been a roaring success.

The children have been introduced to Anubis and mummification, daily life, board games, reed drawing,





hieroglyphic decoding, curses, artefacts and clothing as well as archaeological digs and archery - we have not stopped!

Finally, we enjoyed an exciting science experiment linked to the density of rocks. We had great fun testing whether rocks would float or sink depending on their density.
