Aims of Homework

- To encourage parent/carer partnership in learning
- To encourage dialogue between parents/school, school/pupils and pupils/parents
- To revisit objectives taught in school
- To enhance and support learning
- To encourage good learning habits
- To be interesting and enjoyable

How much homework?

Reading:

Regular reading to, and with, parents and carers is vital. Reading should be enjoyed every day. This is proven to have a significant impact on children's learning.

Activities for home:

Activities for home are sent with your year group newsletter at the start of each new topic and provide activities for you to do with your child.

Reception:

- Enjoy a book each day with your child
- Weekly phonics homework

KS1 (Year 1 & Year 2)

- Hear your child read every day (as a guide 10 minutes a day)
- A weekly English activity, for example phonics or spelling

Lower KS2 (Year 3 to Year 4)

- Regular reading (as a guide 15 minutes a day)
- Spellings



- A weekly Maths or English activity

Upper KS2 (Year 5 to Year 6)

- Regular reading (as a guide 20 minutes a day)
- Spellings
- A weekly Maths activity

All KS1 and 2 children have access to Bug Club and Number Gym at home

The above is a general guide. Sometimes class teachers may give extra pieces of homework such as topic related tasks and projects.

General guidance on homework

Many of the activities sent home in FS2 and KS1 will be ones that involve participation from parents or carers. This provides a way for parents and carers to be actively involved in their child's learning and also provides children with the opportunity to talk about their learning.

As children get older, homework should provide them with the opportunity to develop the skills of independent learning.
